

The Courageous Conversations Series Resumes

Thursday, February 6, 7:00-8:30 p.m.

The theme for 2024–2025 is, "We Belong to One Another." Our February 6 speaker is Rachel Williams, a senior at St. Olaf College studying economics, political science, and religion with a concentration in Middle Eastern studies. Her presentation is called "Rethinking Hope: the Palestinian concept of *Sumud*." She will draw on her 2024 internship in Jerusalem and Palestine to reframe the idea of hope in the context of those living through occupation and war. Rachel is the 2024 recipient of the NJP/I Ruth Hansen Palestine Travel Scholarship.

"Revelation Unveiled: An Enduring Hope" is a new Bible study on the book of Revelation, facilitated by Julie Zdenek, using as a reference her father's notes and lectures on the subject (which he taught here at St. John's in the early 1990s) as well as *Revelation for the Rest of Us* by Scott McKnight.
