
"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory."





St. John's Forum Sunday, February 16, 9:45 a.m.

Ascending the Mountain: Genesis 22 in Jewish and Christian Interpretations with Jason Ripley God's command in Genesis 22 for Abraham to sacrifice Isaac is viewed by many as one of the more terrifying texts of the Bible, and yet it is also often upheld as the pinnacle of faithfulness. In this forum presentation, we will engage in a close reading of this short passage and the questions it poses, and then explore how the Jewish and Christian interpretive traditions have variously grappled with this powerful text. Professor Ripley, an associate professor of Religion at St. Olaf College, is also a member of St. John's.

"Revelation Unveiled: An Enduring Hope" is a new Bible study on the book of Revelation, facilitated by Julie Zdenek, using as a reference her father's notes and lectures on the subject (which he taught here at St. John's in the early 1990s) as well as *Revelation for the Rest of Us* by Scott McKnight.
