



About the Cover Image

The south window of Boe Chapel, designed and completed by the Conrad Pickel Studio of Waukesha, Wisconsin, depicts the transfiguration. In the design the fulfilled promises of the Old Testament are represented in the figures of Moses and Elijah, who flank Jesus, with Peter and James beside them and John below. God's words at the baptism of Christ, "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased," are reiterated here. The lower section of the window addresses the theme of the New Jerusalem, as mentioned in the Revelation of John. The center lancet features the Lamb of God upon the book with seven seals described in Revelation. From the lamb, and the throne of God, runs the river of the water of life.


