### **OUR WORSHIP TODAY**

At the heart of the Good Friday liturgy is the passion story. (For more on the gospel reading, see page 6.) The ancient title for this day—the triumph of the cross—reminds us that the church gathers not to mourn this day but to celebrate Christ's life-giving passion and to find strength and hope in the tree of life. In the ancient bidding prayer we offer petitions for all the world for whom Christ died.

The assembly gathers in silence.







II. Luke 22:54-71 Peter Denies Jesus; Jesus Before the Council









# **OUR GOSPEL READING**

It is the tradition of the lectionary to read the Gospel of John for the Great Three Days. This year we are reading from the Gospel of Luke on Good Friday in order to have continuity with Passion Sunday and Easter.

Contemporary readers are called to wrestle with the ways the gospels downplay the role of the Roman empire in Jesus' crucifixion. Jesus could not have been crucified by any authority other than the occupying government of Rome. Crucifixion was a punishment inflicted upon many Jews and many others who were considered to be a threat to imperial power. Whatever role religious authorities had in turning Jesus over to the Romans, they were not solely responsible for his death.

> In the words of the hymnwriter, Good Friday calls us not to point a finger at "who killed Jesus," but instead to confess: "I it was denied thee. I crucified thee." (ELW No. 349, "Ah, Holy Jesus")
