





All God's children are welcome at the table. Communion will be received standing at the front of the sanctuary; ushers will direct you forward. **Gluten-free wafers** are available in the middle. After you have been served the bread, you will be offered **wine or grape juice**. The **grape juice** is white and is located in the center of the tray. If you are unable to come forward, let an usher know, and communion will be brought to you. On the last Sunday of the month during communion, we offer the practice of anointing with oil on your

brow and receive a blessing. If you want, you may ask for a specific prayer blessing from the anointer.


