¹When the day of Pentecost had come, [the apostles] were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

⁵Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem.

St. John's Forum: Trends in the Christian Church and a Third Way Forward Today, 9:45–10:30 a.m., Sanctuary

Post WWII Christianity has been in decline in America since the 1950s, in both numbers and influence, for multiple reasons. One thing seems clear: since the formation of the Imperial Church under the Roman Empire in the fourth century, there has been an ongoing dispute that has resulted in two gospels: the Personal Gospel, as in, "Have you accepted Jesus as your personal savior," and the Social Gospel, freeing the oppressed from discriminatory social structures and systems. These two perceptions within Christianity have been, in more recent times, torn apart by what has been identified as Political/Fundamentalist Evangelicals who have taken moral piety to the extreme and demonized those not in strict agreement. The result has been that Christians without a well-anchored faith have become frightened, confused, and sometimes harmed, and are falling away from Christianity into a category some call "nones," they also feel the loss of community. We are left with the questions, "How can we attract them into the fold of a more tempered form of Christianity?" and, "How might that more tempered form take shape?" Join St. John's member Gary Engstrom as he offers learnings from a recent Elder Collegium class and a potential "third way" for the Church to move forward.
