Blessing New Paraments

This morning we are blessing a new white parament set. Paraments are hangings and vestments in churches that are found on altars, pulpits, walls, and clergy stoles.

The word parament comes from the Latin word "to adorn" or "to prepare," and they are designed as visual reminders of the church year. Parament colors and symbols invite us into that specific season and help us mark time together as a community. At St. John's we have several sets, including paraments that are blue for Advent, purple for Lent, white for the season of Easter, and a green set for ordinary time.

These new white paraments were designed by St. John's member Judy Swanson and sewn by Cindy Robinson, a Northfield-area sewer. The set is made up of three panels for the altar with matching pieces for both the lectern and the pulpit. They were designed for singular, festival Sundays in the church year when the traditional color is white, such as Holy Trinity Sunday, Christ the King, and Transfiguration. Arches are featured in the design, evoking the arched frame of the altar table legs and the walls of the chancel.

The altar pieces reverse to a field stars for Epiphany Sunday or All Saints.

Many thanks to Judy, Cindy, and all the members of the Chancel Guild for their work on this project. May these paraments help to adorn our space for many years to come.
