



Acts: Catching Up with the Spirit Bible Study

The book of Acts is one of the wildest books in the Bible, according to Professor Matthew Skinner. It contains the stories of prison escapes, rapidly growing Christian communities, a ship wreck, appearances by angels, people sharing all their money with one another for the common good, massive public demonstrations, and a sense of unwavering hope. According to Skinner, "Acts insists that Jesus remains present in human experience through the Holy Spirit, urging believers to keep pace so we can rediscover God among us in the midst of whatever will happen next." Let's spend some time together in the Book of Acts this summer. Pastor Jonathan will lead a 4-week Bible study on Acts, using Skinner's book *Acts: Catching Up with the Spirit*. There will be two offerings for this Bible study. Join us at the following times:

- Wednesday evenings, from 6:30-8:00 p.m., on June 17 and 24, July 1 and 8
- Thursday mornings from 10:00-11:30a.m. on June 18 and 25, July 2 and 9

- First and foremost, stay safe and follow state guidelines for distancing. Connect with neighbors and friends and support each other remotely.

- Local sewers are making **cloth face masks** for use by health care and other essential workers. Material can be picked up in the St. John's parking lot from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. each Monday. - Our Sunday School's **Blessing Box** is seeing a high level of both donations and people receiving these blessings. Nonperishable foods, cleaning supplies, feminine hygiene supplies, and toilet paper are especially welcome donations.
- The **Red Cross** still needs blood, maybe now more than ever. Go to the Red Cross website at www.redcross.com if you are eligible to donate. Drives are still happening locally.
- The **Community Action Center** is preparing for a deluge of needs. The quickest way to help is to donate financially. The CAC can make those gifts go further than your own grocery store donations. They are also building their volunteer base. [For more information visit their website.](#)
- **Local businesses**, especially the ones that are usually social hangouts, are trying to quickly pivot to serve you in different ways. Take advantage of all those take-out and delivery options. And if you can't use them now, buy a gift card that you can use in the future.
- **Relief Efforts for the Neighborhoods** of Minneapolis and St. Paul that have experienced fire and destruction are popping up in many places locally. St. John's will continue to listen for how to help our cities' partners. Our sister congregation Holy Trinity Lutheran on Lake Street has been at the center of relief. 
