

Second Reading — 2 Corinthians 12:2-10

²I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows. ³And I know that such a person—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows—⁴was caught up into Paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat. ⁵On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. ⁶But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, ⁷even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. 

OUR MUSIC TODAY

America! She is most certainly on our minds this July 4th weekend. The organ music is a gift of three American Composers who have focused their talents on music for worship. "Thy Holy Wings" is a gentle setting of the hymn by our own John Ferguson. The offertory music, last week's and this, is from Ned Rorem's "A Quaker Reader." Rorem, (1923-2022,) himself a Quaker, gave us a rich collection of music in his long life time, much of it deeply meditative as is this morning's. Texan David Johnson (1922-1987,) was a Curtis graduate in organ and composition, served in the U.S. Army receiving a Meritorious Service Award and campaign ribbons. After further studies, he was college organist and instructor and department chair at our own St. Olaf College from 1960-1967. Positions at Syracuse and Arizona State followed. The postlude this morning is one of his most famous works.
