# **OUR LITURGY TODAY**

Our liturgy music for July is by composer Richard W. Hillert. In our current hymnal (ELW) it is setting three but it was first published as setting one in Lutheran Book of Worship (LBW) in 1978. This setting's music was groundbreaking in our Lutheran tradition and also included new texts, responses, and prayers. Imagine singing "This Is the Feast" for the first time! LBW, lovingly referred to as the "green book," was first used for worship at St. John's on Thanksgiving Day in 1978. This liturgy was first sung in its entirety on Easter Sunday in 1979 and has been part of our worship life for almost 40 years.

Tomorrow's Topic: Learning to Pray

Who taught you how to pray? Perhaps it was a parent or a grandparent or a pastor. Or perhaps no one ever taught you how to pray. Prayer is a central component of the Christian life and, yet, it can also be hard to know how to pray or even uncomfortable when asked to pray out loud and for others. Has your prayer life gone quiet? In a recent article in the *Christian Century*, Dr. Andrew Root says that when our prayer life goes silent, we tend to miss how God is active in the world.
