


Second Reading — Romans 11:1-2a, 29-32

And if one blind person guides another, both will fall into a pit." ¹⁵But Peter said to him, "Explain this parable to us." ¹⁶Then he said, "Are you also still without understanding? ¹⁷Do you not see that whatever goes into the mouth enters the stomach, and goes out into the sewer? ¹⁸But what comes out of the mouth proceeds from the heart, and this is what defiles. ¹⁹For out of the heart come evil intentions, murder, adultery, fornication, theft, false witness, slander. ²⁰These are what defile a person, but to eat with unwashed hands does not defile."

²¹Jesus left that place and went away to the district of Tyre and Sidon. ²²Just then a Canaanite woman from that region came out and started shouting, "Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David; my daughter is tormented by a demon." ²³But he did not answer her

at all. And his disciples came and urged him, saying, "Send her away, for she keeps shouting after us." ²⁴He answered, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." ²⁵But she came and knelt before him, saying, "Lord, help me." ²⁶He answered, "It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs." ²⁷She said, "Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table." ²⁸Then Jesus answered her, "Woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish." And her daughter was healed instantly.

Capital Campaign

Your Congregational Council has called an **all-congregation meeting for Sunday, August 27, 2023,** to discuss a variety of opportunities and challenges we face in the years ahead. The meeting will be held immediately **following our 9:30 a.m. worship service** that day. The 27th was selected because we felt we had the best opportunity to engage the largest number of members in the discussion and vote. At the meeting, you will be asked:

- 1) to approve investing in improvements of our physical space by installing solar panels and perhaps other sustainability initiatives to reduce our carbon footprint while at the same time positively impacting our long-term financial health;
- 2) to approve the launching of a capital campaign to address a number of physical needs of our church and improve our benevolence to support other missions that complement the St. John's mission;
- 3) to approve the acceptance of a generous loan from the St. John's Foundation of \$100,000. This is an exciting time for our congregation and we have been deeply blessed. Much more information will be shared at the congregational meeting. Please plan to attend.
