#### First Reading — Exodus 32:7-14

<sup>7</sup>The LORD said to Moses, "Go down at once! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; <sup>8</sup>they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshiped it and sacrificed to it, and said, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" <sup>9</sup>The LORD said to Moses, "I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are. <sup>10</sup>Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them

and I may consume them; and of you I will make a great nation."







## TTT Our Music Today

9/11/2001. Driving over the mountain from Ridgewood, NJ, I had a too-perfect view of the NYC skyline. The smoke was rising from the first tower. Silence was deafening all week as air traffic was stopped from the busy metro-politan airports. Commuter trains run through the center of Ridgewood with pedestrian tunnels to help commuters pass under the tracks. I will never forget seeing people pour out of those walkways, covered in ash.
