# St. John's Forum: Earl Schwartz—"Who is like your people Israel, a singular Nation?": Jewish "Chosenness" as a Source of Inspiration and Tension Today, 9:45 a.m., Sanctuary

The St. John's forum continues its series on interpreting the Bible with sensitivity to other faith traditions with a presentation by Professor Earl Schwartz, "Who is like your people Israel, a singular nation?": Jewish 'Chosenness' as a Source of Inspiration and Tension." Christians are familiar with the biblical story of how the tribes of Israel came to understand their origin and purpose as covenantal partners with a sole, sovereign God. In this presentation, Schwartz begins with the extraordinary endurance of the Jewish descendants of those Israelites, which has generated questions about why such an identity developed among these particular people. He explores three themes that have come to be associated with these questions: divine decree, ancestry, and an instructed way of life, and he asks what Christians—also heirs of Abrahamic traditions—can learn from the ways in which these themes have wended their way through this uniquely Jewish story. Before his retirement, Schwartz taught in the religion department of Hamline University and was the first director of Hamline's program in social justice studies. He has also served on the faculty of the Talmud Torah of St. Paul and has written extensively on Jewish moral education and social ethics.
