

## **Second Reading** — 2 Timothy 3:14—4:5


<sup>14</sup>But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it <sup>15</sup>and how from childhood you have known sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. <sup>16</sup>All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in right-eousness, <sup>17</sup>so that the person of God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.




