The messages of our scriptures tell us that we must give special care to those struggling to meet their basic needs. Compassion and fairness (though not necessarily sameness) are the tools that should drive us. In Minnesota, tax credits and refunds can be important measures to promote economic stability. Ask candidates: "Will you ensure that our tax code includes the Working Family Credit and Child, Dependent Care Credit, and Child Tax Credit? Can you commit to protecting the Property Tax Refund, which protects low-income homeowners and renters, in Minnesota's tax code?"


