





#### ELCA World Hunger

- Hunger Facts: 821 million people around the world—that's more than 1 in 10—can't access the food they need to live active, healthy lives. According to the most recent estimates, 736 million people live in extreme poverty on less than \$1.90 per day. That's 10% of the world's population. At some point in 2017 (the most recent year available), more than 40 million people in the United States were unsure where their next meal might come from. 39.7 million Americans were living in poverty in 2017. For a family of four, this means their annual household income was below \$25,094.
- As members of the ELCA, we are called to respond to these staggering needs. Since the onset of Covid-19, these conditions have only worsened.
- Working with and through our congregations, in the United States, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands, Lutheran churches overseas and other partners, ELCA World Hunger is uniquely positioned to reach communities in need.
