Next week, choirs from across Minnesota will gather at Orchestra Hall in Minneapolis to celebrate the 151<sup>st</sup> anniversary of F. Melius Christiansen. While Christiansen is remembered as the founder of the St. Olaf Choir, he was also the faithful organist and choir director at St. John's for over 30 years. His gifts to the choral music tradition began in this sanctuary and have since been shared across the world. While we are accustomed to hearing his music in concert settings, so much of what he composed was intended for use in worship. Today, in the spirit of thanksgiving, we lift up his music throughout our service.

At the 10:45 service we welcome pianist Dina Dautova Dina is a high school senior at Shattuck-St. Mary's in Faribault, where she studies at the Pre-Conservatory Center of Excellence. She's preparing for her senior concerts, which will be held at Shattuck-St. Mary's Chapel of the Good Shepherd on April 19<sup>th</sup> and Sundin Hall in Minneapolis on the evening of April 29<sup>th</sup>.
