





Welcome Back Handbells!



Today we celebrate the return of our newly refurbished handbells. Earlier this summer, the handbells journeyed back to Pennsylvania to undergo a full refurbishment by Schulmerich, the company that made them. The majority of our bells were first purchased in 1981, and they were ready for some work. In the refurbishment process, Schulmerich carefully took each bell apart, cleaned it, and installed new clappers and handles. They also polished and re-tuned each one before sending them back to us. The bells

now look and sound better than ever, and this maintenance helps insure they ring beautifully for many years to come. Thank you to Mary Kay Bougie and St. Peter's Lutheran Church for the use of their space and handbells while ours were away this fall.


