While we do not always agree, we choose to walk and grow in faith together, believing that God creates diversity, and loves and welcomes us.




HEARING GOD'S WORD

Children's Message

First Reading — Judges 9:8-15

The trees once went out to anoint a king over themselves. 
Second Reading — Colossians 1:11-20

"May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully ¹²giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. ¹³He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, ¹⁴in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.






