# Benevolence and Social Concerns Board Kathy Shea, Chair Notes July 9, 2019

#### Adult Education

The subcommittee from Benevolence and Social Concern and Adult Education (Jo Franklin, Kathy Schuurman, Kathy Shea, Merilyn Calcutt and Rob Quanbeck) met to decide on speakers and who would contact speakers for the series on Environmental Sustainability with 6 Adult Forums on Sunday mornings followed by the WELCA event on Environmental Stewardship in April 2020 (April 2 or 4). Speakers with background in specific areas will be asked to give an overview of the topic and also speak about what is happening locally and/or what individuals can do to make a difference.

The dates for each topic are listed below and the speaker is listed if confirmed. September 22 - Climate Crisis – Anne Gothmann, St. Olaf October 20 - Environmental Justice with a focus in indigenous people November 17 – Energy Use – Martha Larson, Carleton

January 19 – Agriculture – Dave Legvold and ? February 16 – Water – Kristi Pursell? March 15 – Ethics and biodiversity

### Missionary Support

Because the Klines are leaving Columbia we discussed how to use the \$2000 in missionary support we have been sending them. Katie Kline worked with developing curriculum as well as providing education retreats for teachers of the four Lutheran secondary schools. IELCO rarely requests funds and is asking for funds for these schools for the building of four 'canopy' structures to protect children and staff from the elements (mostly blistering sun and heavy rain) during the school day. Once funds have been secured for all four schools each will build this essential structure. The consensus of the committee was to extend Katie Kline's commitment to education by using our funds to support this project.

Steward your gifts - Gifts and Abilities Survey

After a visit from the Stewardship Committee, we discussed the proposed time and talent survey sent out by Mike Roth in a June 24 email. General comments were

- 1) don't have everyone fill it out unless there is follow up about what people say they are interested in doing
- 2) give more information on options
- 3) perhaps just give it to new people for now and see how it works.

## Legal Clinic

Kathy Schuurman reported that 11 people came today to the legal clinic, the most ever and some had issues other than immigration.

Sara Karki (Immigration Law Center of MN) had two summer interns (Carleton students- undergrads) who came to help. The Immigrant Law Center will be getting a new director and participation in Northfield depends on new director. The Volunteer Lawyer Network will continue to support this clinic.
