World Hunger - The appeal for World Hunger at St. John's is in November. We have announcements in the Voice, the email news blast and the weekly church bulletin. We talked about trying to put up posters to make people more aware of it, but we don't have posters. We will ask Leah about downloading something from the website to put on the TV screens.

Adult Forums on Creation Care

We have had three speakers this fall who spoke on climate change, energy use and water use. Next we will have a talk on agriculture on Jan 19 with farmer David Legvold. We still need to find a speaker on social justice – Jo will talk with Kathy Schuurman. WELCA has invited Rev. Jim Bear to talk on March 5 about indigenous justice. We hope to find a similar speaker for the Forum on Feb. 16. Jo Franklin will look into this.

Budget-

The St John's Church Council approved our request to the St. John's Foundation for \$1000 for

Augusta Victoria Hospital in Jerusalem and \$1000 for the Border Servant Corp through SE MN Global Missions. Augusta Victoria recently received additional funds for an addition for care of the elderly through United Nations funding (UNHWR) and other Muslim funds.

We still have about \$600 left in discretionary funds for 2019. We expect to talk about budget planning for 2020 at our next (December) meeting.

Missions

We discussed Pastor Pam's suggestion of inviting the director of Lutheran Mideast Development, an organization with deep roots on the Turkish/Syrian border with ministry with the Kurds, to speak at St. John's. He will be in MN from Feb 21-March 10. We would like to ask him to present at a Sunday Forum.

We also discussed posting information about Rev. Mark Rich and Rev. Cynthia Holder Rich who are missionaries we help support in Tanzania. They have written a Lenten devotional, with a focus on women, that will be available in January. Their web site is MandCinTZ.com. The global missions bulletin board has been moved and is in need of current information.

Evangelism and Communications Committee Minutes for November 12, 2019 Noon, St. John's Hall

- 1. ECC reviewed Church Council discussions of October 29.
- 2. The ECC meeting focused on the Council request that ECC undertake an inventory and assessment of all St. John's communications platforms and related communications. ECC (Kristin Partlo and Daniel Edwins) is developing an inventory list, comprising categories such as print, web, and video, as well as ad hoc communications sent by individual boards, committees, and programs. Regarding the schedule of the review, ECC will provide inventory by January and then begin an assessment of the primary communications platforms, concluding the effort in May 2020.
- 3. ECC will continue to conduct oral histories as follow up to the 150th anniversary.; lining up fall interviews
- 4. The Board discussed use thus far of the big screen tv, finding that the purchase is meeting expectations. We discussed also replacing old tube tv's with inexpensive panel ones.
- 5. Hearing Loop and related technology, update: ECC is developing new signage, since the current signage is not highly visible. ECC will also continue to implement a pilot project re. software installation for closed captioning, pilot
- 6. Gleason and Zdenek have completed the installation of digital video recording equipment. Initial results are positive, but there will be several issues to resolve, including making of analog dvd's of digital recordings.
