- 3) Operation Backpack in Northfield for money for backpacks and school supplies,
- 4) Bread for the World, as they urge the passage of the Global Nutrition Resolution in the US Congress to improve maternal and child nutrition,

## **Budget**

We agreed to postpone spending from our discretionary budget – we have about \$600 left – until we see if income to the operating budget allows us to spend the full budgeted amount.

We have \$2000 remaining in the mission budget of \$6000 and plan to ask the St. John's Foundation for this \$2000 to fund \$1000 to Border Servant Corp – part of SE MN Global Missions and \$1000 to Augusta Victoria Hospital in Jerusalem. This hospital provides needed services to Palestinians.

World Hunger Appeal at St. Johns

We ask St. John's members for donations for World Hunger during November (there is an offering envelope in the envelope packet. Carolyn Nitz agreed to write an article for the November Voice (due Oct. 15) and November News Blasts.
