Benevolence and Social Concerns Notes for Benevolence and Social Concerns Board, May 8 2018

1. We bring treats for June 12 meeting. Most of our members are out of town in June. Jane and Gretchen will bring treats.

2. Request for ELW Hymnals. We will purchase the 10 hymnals requested, using benevolence discretionary funds. Cost for 10=\$225. Here is the request:

My name is Kris Swanson (Scott is my dad). I work for a wonderful ELCA affiliated camp called Wilderness Canoe Base in northern Minnesota. We are currently using the green LWB hymnals for worship but don't have many of them and the few we have are in sad shape. I would love for us to have the new red ELW hymnals that have much more music that campers are familiar with but unfortunately there just isn't money for the camp to buy them. I'm reaching out to you to see if you and the congregation would be able to sponsor the purchase of a number of new hymnals. It would be wonderful if you could sponsor ten hymnals but the camp and I would be so grateful for any help you are able to give. 3. local fund started to help families pay for a municipal ID cards.

We decided to contribute \$150 from discretionary benevolence. The Peace and Justice group also donated \$150. The cards cost \$15, so the total will fund 20 people.

4. John Keller, director of the Immigrant Law Center of Minnesota, came to discuss the grant request made to the 150th Anniversary Grace Overflowing. The ILC only works with poor people who cannot afford legal help. The grant requests \$25,000 to pay for a .25 employee who would

come to Northfield 2 days/month, and work out of the St. Paul office the remaining hours, doing the legal paper work related to Nfld cases. They would educate, work with any local lawyers who are interested, provide legal work etc. They currently have interns from both St. Olaf and Carleton, and having a local presence would enhance this. Sustainability would include seeking funding from the colleges, local employers, the city, local nonprofits and individuals. ILC has development staff to work on fund raising for the long haul. Pam has been at local meetings with others in the community working on these issues, and she will facilitate bringing ILC together with those groups. Kathy Schuurman, on the B&SC board, will be a point person for St. John's. She and Pam will bring this to the May council meeting for approval by the council.

Property & Grounds Board

Completed Projects

- Stain glass window was removed, repaired and re-installed. Included repair of rotten window frame.
- Nurse office is moved.
- Mud Jack in several areas
- Basement kitchen exhaust vent removed and capped
- Narthex roof leak repaired
- Lawn service is set for the summer

Projects in process

- Air conditioning and air exchange should be done this week
- Sanctuary and Narthex painting. Best for summer 2019. Will need to discuss challenges related to the quotes.
- Entry Canopy will get done. Have not heard timeline from Doug.
- South East entry pavement crack will get replaced. We are looking at drainage possibilities.
- Improved drainage in the NW parking lot near the kitchen will be addressed at the same time as the sidewalk repairs are made.
- Handicap ramps: Areas of curb and sidewalk to be replaced with slopes for easier access.
- Outlets in serving area outside of the kitchen are high and a trip hazard. They will be replaced with units that are more flush with the floor.
- Tuck Pointing: Have received 2 formal quotes along with the one older quote. Last Friday our final contractor did an inspection with quote expected in a week. Good news is that the lowest quote so far will be about \$20,000 below our initial quote.

Projects taken off the list

- Pews. Overall we did not like the final results of the blasting and refinishing. Before looking at options such as much more expensive hand sanding/refinishing or replacement with new, the Property Board is tabling the project until further guidance is provided. We suggest that the Worship and Arts board or other relevant groups discuss to determine if St Johns should move forward with refinishing/replacement or keep the current pews.
- Fellowship hall. This project appears more appropriate for completion in the next few years rather than this year. Property board has investigated costs and challenges related to the basement floor and related space. We are now at a stopping point because there is no long term plan for the space. We have heard several suggestions but nothing formal or final. As with the pews, the Property Board is tabling the project until further guidance is provided. We suggest a team of people who use or may use the space develop a long term plan for the space.

New issues:

- Concerns about the darkness of the East and South side of the facility were brought to our attention. It seems dark and unwelcoming. We will each look at the facility after dark and come back with suggestions. Tim stated there are burnt out lights. It may just take replacing those.
- Paining the sanctuary has brought up the question of color. This issue may be best resolved by the Worship and Arts board.
