One service Sundays start this Sunday 9:30: Some glitches with details we did not think about included bulletin count issues, which usher team would be on duty, coffee before *and* after service? (It's welcoming before service, to have coffee...), pew "regulars" will have to share... Pam and Jon are working on facilitating acquainting ourselves with each other through childrens' message  $\rightarrow$  nametags, talking to people around you, etc.

Sanctuary Piano leaving for repairs on Tuesday -

Air conditioner is having humidity issues, which has taken its toll on the pianos/organ. The monies for repairs may come from building and grounds funds.

Tarkel Price wants to go to music camp again – 1) has agreed to play in church end of August 2) will be asked to provide something in the September voice about it, and, possibly speaking in church about his experience? We approved applying \$500 to costs for this coming session. Pews – are they original to the church? Nobody knows.... Why do we need to do anything? We agreed this project's position should be at the bottom of the list. Basement is far more pressing. Carolyn voiced some interest in the possibility of creating a hymn – the board would do well to offer her a formal invitation, contingent upon what other composers are doing

### Major Celebration Event Dates:

Jan 13 Ole Choir visit -- Nathan and Michele Knutsen possible co-chairs, but W/A may take lead in planning

April 27, Sunday after Easter Jennifer Edwins: chair – Resurrection Window unveiled – W/A may be tasked with coming up with some options as to where it goes. Each panel is about 3'x5'. Minus the framing.

July outdoor event – Sue Brockman and Brian Evenson: co-chairs October 25-26-27 Big festival celebration: Amy McBroom – chair Sculpture visit: Next Thursday or Friday --

**FERG**: Provided general information and considerations regarding the commissioning process: Composers may ask for input as to what the commissioners have in mind-- What kind of choir [ensemble], and what vision for orchestration; based on a hymn? Fees: everyone is different. Some have a standard fee for normal things. Some charge by the minute (performance duration of finished work). Some have a sliding scale based on complexity. Most composers won't take offense at the inquiry of cost. One should not assume or request a work be performed gratis for a birthday celebration: this should come from the composer.

Text: rights/royalties have changed – publisher is responsible for things under copyright- the commissioning group may expect to pay royalties if they sing the piece before it is published. \$100 for non-biblical text. Copywritten text used without permission can be big, expensive trouble.

Possible to commission someone to do the text – Ferg advises collaboration between music and text composition.

Suggests the piece be one that "enriches church universal", use text that hasn't been done much, or take an existing text and give it a new set of clothes (or new eyes)

Bruce Benson: text?

Hymn concertato – or Anthem, depending on text, intended performance group, etc.

Theme: Environment – care of the environment – caring for creation. There are hymns that celebrate creation but not about what our responsibility is towards caring for creation Ferg stated that he was not interested in writing a liturgy necessarily.

Scott suggested : "sing to color" in environment references to color are lacking in the Bible Judy Swanson to collaborate????

Give them until AUGUST meeting to have something for us (so we know how to approach others). Nancy will send out a thank you note to Ferg, and suggest this "soft deadline" for some progress with Bruce and Judy to be on our August agenda.

As far as Ferg is concerned, the premier does not have to be a big deal.

Lent – History – oral histories – music history (all the composers affiliated with this place and the body of works that have bubbled up from this place) – which could also be appropriate to share during the January 13 event.
