From Our Pastors

Dear Beloved of God:

As Governor Walz called for renewed restrictions to curb the uncontrolled spread of COVID-19, our state was in the "red" zone, and officials anticipated that the next several weeks would be difficult. Northfield School District has also moved to distance learning for all ages until at least January.

This news arrived as we your pastors have been hearing of church members and neighbors who are ill from the virus. We are deeply concerned for the physical, mental and spiritual health of our community.

During the late summer and early fall we enjoyed outdoor events with you, and as staff we have been dreaming about some options for our holiday celebrations as a congregation. Sadly, we had to shelve many of these ideas, but we remain committed to offering safe opportunities for connection, worship and prayer in the days ahead.

In this newsletter you will find the full schedule for worship for this Advent/Christmas season.

Until circumstances change, the restriction that we as a church need to attend to is this: indoor **and** outdoor social gatherings are now limited to 10 people from no more than 3 separate households. While these restrictions do not apply to religious worship **services**, they eliminate the possibility of in-person board meetings, circle meetings, or youth gatherings for the foreseeable future.

As your pastors we have heard many of you say "you must be so busy." While it is true that our days have continued to be full during this pandemic, connecting with you continues to be the core of our work. Please do not hesitate to contact us if you need to talk, if you are struggling with mental health or practical needs, or if you want ideas about how to help our community during this time.

As Pastor Jonathan said in his children's sermon on Sunday, November 8, it is vital that we as a church "**en-courage**" one another during this time. Give one another courage, lean on the courage of others when



you need it, and know that as we enter the Advent season of hope, Christ will be our light.

These are ______times that make me feel ______. How would you fill in those blanks? Uncertain...uncomfortable? Challenging... worried? Scary... anxious? Desperate...panicky?

All of those responses may be appropriate; recognizing and acknowledging each of them as legitimate may be helpful as we find our way through 2020's dark holidays. Measures of physical health, of recovery and death, are the headlines every day, and our mental health shapes how we manage that information, as well as our own possible COVID-19 experiences.

Stephen Ministers have invited Naomi Bartley, a licensed professional clinical counselor (<u>http://naomibartley.com</u>), to be our guest for a virtual gathering on **Tuesday, December 15, at 7:00 p.m**. She will host a conversation around handling the losses and fears that characterize daily life as we now know it. Sally Lindell, our Parish Nurse, will also be involved.

From St. John's Women

During 2020, St. John's Women have continued working on a number of projects that provide items for those in need both locally and globally. As a result of these efforts, they are responsible for making and donating the following this past year:

- 40 quilts to Lutheran World Relief and Community Action Center
- 46 sweaters, 116 caps, and two baby blankets to World Vision's Knit for Kids
- 20 caps and 10 quilted baby blankets to Community Action Center
- 18 sweaters with matching hats and baby blankets with matching hats to Ruth's House
- 110 Personal Care Kits to Lutheran World Relief
- As soon as able, they will compile and deliver 50+ Baby Care Kits to LWR

October Red Cross Blood Drive Update

On October 28 and 29, St. John's hosted the Red Cross Blood Drive for Carleton College in our spacious St. John's Hall, as the college was unable to host on its campus due to COVID-19 restrictions. During the drive we safely welcomed 88 donors and collected 85 pints of blood – a complete success and a vital service, especially considering the increased need in the community for blood during this time.

Property and Grounds

On Saturday, October 31, several volunteers assisted in the annual fall clean-up at St. John's. The weather was mild that day, and a lot of good work was accomplished in a small amount of time. Leaves and debris were cleared from the parking lots, and the gardens were cut back and tidied up. **Thank you** to all who helped with keeping the grounds of our church clean and presentable!

Holden Village 2021?

With a hopeful stance toward next summer, we are pondering a St. John's trip to Holden Village in 2021. If pandemic-possible, Holden would be open to cohorts for 5 night stays. An all-inclusive price would include the boat ticket, meals, room, and programming. Guests would be responsible for their own travels to and from Chelan Washington (Field's Point). Community Action Center Update

As some of you might already know, the Community Action Center (CAC) in Northfield has been at the center of the COVID-19 crisis this year. Over the past 7 months, the CAC has been navigating a sky-rocketing need for assistance to families and individuals, as well as organizing a Northfield community taskforce of care, for when the virus surges in our community.

This spring, the CAC organized and mobilized so that community members could still access the food shelf and financial assistance services in a way that was safe, yet still relational. They created 3 teams out of their staff, who would rotate working remotely and working on-site, so that in the event of an outbreak among staff – two teams would still be available to provide services. In the midst of restricting how to provide these services, the CAC has had to navigate a staggering increase in need in our community.

Here are some quick facts: In May, the CAC was serving 315 families per month. By September, that number climbed to around 750 families per month. Historically, the CAC has provided about 50 nights of hotel shelter per year. By October, they had already provided over 400 nights of hotel shelter in just the past 6 months. Perhaps the most staggering statistic is this: By April the CAC had spent around \$10,000 on housing assistance. However, by October, the CAC was nearing \$140,000 spent on housing assistance. They are already on track to spend 17 year's worth of housing aid in 2020 alone.

In the midst of this, the CAC has continued to focus on the need for affordable housing in Northfield. As part of our 150th Anniversary, St. John's provided a grant to the CAC for an affordable housing project, now known as Hillcrest Village. Hillcrest Village will contain 17 housing units – 3 emergency housing, 6 transitional housing, and 8 affordable housing. This project is still developing, but the CAC hopes to break ground in the summer of 2021. Expect to hear more about how St. John's and you can invest in this need in our community.

Throughout this unprecedented year, the CAC has expanded to reflect the growing needs of the community. The CAC is one of our ministry partners and St. John's is committed to continuing to support them as they compassionately care for our community in these challenging times. **Thank you** for the support you have given and continue to give to the CAC through donations and volunteer hours!
