

BRIEF HISTORICAL AND CULTURAL CONTEXT:

Reviewing the past two lessons in John chapter 12:

Chapter 12 begins with the anointing of Jesus' feet, plans to kill Jesus and Lazarus, the parade into Jerusalem, and Jesus' final public discourse—to Greek Gentiles.

The Anointing: Discuss what you recall about Mary anointing Jesus and the significance of Judas and the money?

The Triumphal Entry: (Palm Sunday): Recall from lessons in Mark's Gospel—what was happening at the opposite side of town while Jesus was riding in to Jerusalem on a donkey?

The Greek Gentiles: Explain the significance of Jesus' discourse with Gentiles, where he offers them a mini Gospel in three verses.

Read John 12:37-43

This passage contains a quote from Isaiah 6:10, which is requoted SIX times by New Testament writers; once in each gospel, the book of Acts, and in Romans. We will take a look at those, but first look at how John is using this Isaiah passage:

Read again vv 37-39 and 42-43 for context **Read aloud** the Isaiah quotes:

Isaiah 6:9-10 Matthew 13:13–15

Mark 4:11-13 Luke 8:9-10 John 12:39-41 Acts 28:25-28

Romans 11:8

What promise accompanies each quote? Discuss the quote within John's context.

Read the following passages and list the attributes of one who wants us to be blind and deaf:
