## **Relevant Scriptures**

## To Whom Does God Give Attention?

**Exodus 22:** <sup>21</sup> You shall not wrong or oppress a resident alien, for you were aliens in the land of Egypt. <sup>22</sup> You shall not abuse any widow or orphan. <sup>23</sup> If you do abuse them, when they cry out to me, I will surely heed their cry; <sup>24</sup> my wrath will burn, and I will kill you with the sword, and your wives shall become widows and your children orphans.

**Deuteronomy 10:** <sup>17</sup> For the LORD your God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great God, mighty and awesome, who is not partial and takes no bribe, <sup>18</sup> who executes justice for the orphan and the widow, and who loves the strangers, providing them food and clothing.

**Deuteronomy 14:** <sup>28</sup> Every third year you shall bring out the full tithe of your produce for that year, and store it within your towns; <sup>29</sup> the Levites, because they have no allotment or inheritance with you, as well as the resident aliens, the orphans, and the widows in your towns, may come and eat their fill so that the LORD your God may bless you in all the work that you undertake.

**Deuteronomy 24**: <sup>17</sup> You shall not deprive a resident alien or an orphan of justice; you shall not take a widow's garment in pledge. <sup>18</sup> Remember that you were a slave in Egypt and the LORD your God redeemed you from there; therefore I command you to do this. <sup>19</sup> When you reap your harvest in your field and forget a sheaf in the field, you shall not go back to get it; it shall be left for the alien, the orphan, and the widow, so that the LORD your God may bless you in all your undertakings. <sup>20</sup> When you beat your olive trees, do not strip what is left; it shall be for the alien, the orphan, and the widow. <sup>21</sup> When you gather the grapes of your vineyard, do not glean what is left; it shall be for the alien, the orphan, and the widow. <sup>22</sup> Remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt; therefore I am commanding you to do this.

Psalm 146: <sup>5</sup> Happy are those whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the LORD their God, <sup>6</sup> who made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them; who keeps faith forever; <sup>7</sup> who executes justice for the oppressed; who gives food to the hungry. The LORD sets the prisoners free; <sup>8</sup> the LORD opens the eyes of the blind. The LORD lifts up those who are bowed down; the LORD loves the righteous. <sup>9</sup> The LORD watches over the strangers; he upholds the orphan and the widow, but the way of the wicked he brings to ruin.

**Proverbs 15:** <sup>25</sup> The LORD tears down the house of the proud, but maintains the widow's boundaries.

## **Relevant Scriptures**

Isaiah 1: <sup>16</sup> Wash yourselves; make yourselves clean; remove the evil of your doings from before my eyes; cease to do evil, <sup>17</sup> learn to do good; seek justice, rescue the oppressed, defend the orphan, plead for the widow.

**Zechariah 7:** <sup>8</sup> The word of the LORD came to Zechariah, saying: <sup>9</sup> Thus says the LORD of hosts: Render true judgments, show kindness and mercy to one another; <sup>10</sup> do not oppress the widow, the orphan, the alien, or the poor; and do not devise evil in your hearts against one another.
