Dear Friends in Christ:

Unless you've been hiding under a rock, you're probably aware that this October marks a major historical anniversary. 500 years ago in Wittenberg Germany, Martin Luther posted the 95 Theses that turned out to be the beginning of the Protestant Reformation (and, our Roman Catholic brothers and sisters would point out, a Counter-Reformation).

It's hard to overstate just how big a shift the Reformation was. In that century the religious, political and social climate of western Europe changed dramatically. Historians have plenty to debate about - including whether anything was actually "nailed" to the church doors at Wittenberg on October 31, 1517 - but there is consensus that the Reformation was important not only for the church but for the entire society. This 500th anniversary is being talked about far beyond the confines of Lutheran church education classes.

For those of us in the Lutheran church, however, 2017 is a time of **reflection** on both our theological center and our ecumenical relationships. We're not content to review history or sing our Lutheran fight songs as we do every year. All through this year, we reflect on what it means to be a people of grace and freedom now, in a time when *our* society is undergoing a seismic shift. Here at St. John's, October and beyond will be full of opportunities for you to join in this reflection.

In education opportunities, we will be telling the story of the Reformation - in catechism classes for 4th and 5th graders, in confirmation classes with 6th-8th graders, and in "Reformation 101" adult forums. We'll be asking parents to join in with their confirmation students for a refresher on Lutheranism. For all adults, WELCA is offering a return to the Apostles' Creed in a monthly Bible study with Eric Lund.

In worship, we will especially mark this anniversary on October 29, with special music from J. S. Bach's Reformation Cantata. We will also continue praying for the unity of the church as we invite St. Dominic's to share in our Thanksgiving Eve worship on November 22.

In celebration, we will have a Reformation Fair on October 29 during the education hour. All ages will join together for a Reformation play, trivia quizzes, art projects, root beer floats (a special "indulgence"), and maybe hammering on some doors of our own!

In solidarity and community, we will remember Luther's commitment to the hungry poor with the CROP Walk on the afternoon of October 29, joining with churches from all over Northfield to raise funds to fight hunger. And then Sunday evening we will celebrate at Imminent Brewing with "Beer and Hymns." Our ELCA congregations will come together for music and fun led by "The Fleshpots of Egypt," a band (including son of St. John's Rolf Jacobson) that plays "hymns as if the Reformation had started in Appalachia."

The church of Christ is ever-changing, ever-re-formed by God's Spirit, but God's grace is never-failing. Join us as we reflect and renew during this 500th year!

Stephen Ministry: Coping with Grim News

These are challenging times. While we Minnesotans enjoy a gorgeous fall our sisters and brothers to the south are living through unimaginable natural disasters. Whether or not we have connections to individuals there, our hearts go out to those who have lost everything. Locked on their images, we may have trouble sleeping or focusing on the needs of those around us. How can we respond appropriately to real but distant pain without feeling overwhelmed? What can we do? Here are three tips for handling the stress of disasters both up close and beyond our control.

- 1. Do something, but be realistic about physical and financial contributions you can make. Put your related skills to use if that is feasible; donate what you can to reliable response groups such as the ELCA.
- 2. Stay informed. Follow accurate news, (including reports that may affect your own safety) without obsessing over minute-by-minute details. Note how and with what you might help meet critical needs and rejoice in the progress that is made toward healing and rebuilding.
- 3. Pray, trusting that God's peace and strength are available to all who feel weary and lost.

We will meet on the following Mondays from 6:00-7:30 p.m. at Froggy Bottoms.



HOSPITAL VISITATION is available daily if the pastors are notified that you are admitted at Northfield Hospital. Please notify the hospital when you are admitted that you are a St. John's member, or notify the church office directly. The on-call line will give you the name of the pastor on-call 24/7.

If you are admitted to the hospital out of town, please notify the church office, as most hospitals do not relay this information to churches. Northfield Hospital also cannot tell us where you are discharged to if you are released to a care center or rehabilitation.

The Called to Care team regularly offers meals, cards, and other signs of care to those who are going through short-term crisis. If you know someone who could use a dose of extra care, contact the church office.
