

Lent Begins February 22 with Ash Wednesday

Lent, our springtime period of renewal and focus on repentance and life in Christ, begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22, with worship and the imposition of ashes at noon and 6:15 p.m.

The ashes we receive on our foreheads remind us that we, along with all of creation, are dependent on God's grace.

Mid-week worship begins the following week, March 1, at 6:15 p.m. and continues March 8, March 15, March 22, and March 29.



Blessing Box at St. John's

The congregation of St. John's continues to support the "Blessing Box", a mission that started in the fall of 2017. It is similar to the Little Libraries found around town except the Blessing box is filled with donated non-perishable food and personal hygiene products. The idea is that anyone who may be struggling can use the goods to make ends meet. The community is welcome to donate to the box being mindful of Minnesota's temperature changes. Donation Ideas (please check expiration dates): canned goods, pasta, flour, sugar, coffee, crackers, soap, mittens, toothbrush, baby items, such as diapers and pacifiers. The box is located in the drive-up on the north side of St. John's.

From Our Pastors

Pastor Pam's devotion from the annual meeting:

"I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, 'for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind - 'fjust as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you - 'so that you are not lacking in any gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ." – 1 Corinthians 1:4-7

The newest edition of the NRSV – called the NRSV-UE – includes some small changes in translation. Most of them are not earth-shaking, but they do give food for thought.

In 1 Corinthians 1:7, the NRSV said "spiritual gifts," but the updated edition simplifies that one word in Greek to a one word in English: "gifts."

So often when we talk about gifts in our culture, it is in an individual context. We give gifts at holidays, and we celebrate the gifts – that is the talents – of people whose abilities we admire. Gifts are best shared, but we still think of them as belonging to **one** person or another.

But in Corinthians, Paul is addressing a whole community, the new church he founded in that city. The community is experiencing division and disagreements, but before he gets to talking about their problems, he makes this bold statement: "You are not lacking in *any* gift."

It is so easy for the church to believe that we will be well, or successful, when we have just a little more than we already have now. Not a day goes by that there isn't some social media post about the decline of the church in our time. But the story of decline assumes that the numbers – be they of membership or attendance or offerings – tell the story of God's work. And Paul insists that the story of God's mission is not a story of scarcity.

You are not lacking in any gift. Since we the church are still waiting for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ, these words are for us as well. We have already received what we need.


So, the question is not "do we have enough?" The question is, "who are all these gifts for?"

It's a question we must each ask ourselves individually as stewards of God's grace. I believe that when each one of us faithfully answers the call to share the gifts we have been given, we will discover that collectively, as God's people together, we do indeed have everything we need.

St. John's Stephen Ministers have been trained to offer this kind of support.





Wednesday Confirmation Youth Groups

We continue to invest in community building among our Youth, exploring aspects of *UBUNTU* - an African worldview centered around the interconnectedness of humanity, nature and God. Our hope is to create a space where youth can grow in faith with friends under the guidance of awesome faithful mentors. We aim to have fun and care for one another while learning to live Christian lives together.

Wrapping up the St. John's Hall Acoustic Improvement Project

St. John's is bringing to a conclusion the Acoustic Improvement Project for St. John's Hall. It has taken two decades to finally put in place the kind of reverberation control originally planned for the Hall but never installed due to construction budget constraints. For over a year, the Church Council and boards have been reviewing proposals and plans. ESI, an acoustic engineering firm, provided specifications for taming the reverberation. Twin Cities Acoustics did the work. Some adjusting of acoustic panel placement may be needed to obtain optimal results.

The project cost is \$44,000. Primary project funding is provided by the balance of Grace Overflowing capital funds. Currently, members have donated \$18,000, and we have a goal of current donations providing 50% of the project funding. If you are interested in making a contribution to the project, which is part of the church's overall ministry and commitment to the hearing-impaired you may make a donation to the project between now and the end of February.

As the St. John's Hall Acoustic Improvement project wraps up its work, the Evangelism & Communication Board thanks all those who helped make the project possible, and especially those who served on the Acoustics Upgrade Committee, including Paul Beck of Worship & Arts; Rob Quanbeck from Adult Ministry; Gene Bakko of Property & Grounds; Dennis Rinehart of Faith & Health; and Mark Gleason of Evangelism & Communication, board chair. We also thank David Nitz, who provided acoustical analysis; Maribeth Beck for advice regarding the needs of the hearing impaired; Dave Zdenek for audio-visual support; Nathan Knutson for project process and design; and Jill Enestvedt for production of computer-assisted design documents. Tim Byers provided ongoing assistance, including retrieval of the original St. John's Hall design documents, as developed by Steve Edwins and SMSQ Architects. As always, our pastors provided support and encouragement, and the Church Council made crucial commitments of resources. Our special thanks go out to generous donors who helped to ensure project momentum, and to current donors who are helping make the Hall an important resource for the future.

Christian Nationalism: What It Is, Why It Matters and How We Can Respond Thursday, March 2nd, 2023 7:00pm St John's Hall (in person only)

American Christians have always struggled with the relationship between church and state. But in recent years the alignment between right-wing politics and Christianity has taken on a new intensity in a movement called "Christian Nationalism." This power grab co-opts the language and symbols of Christianity, deceiving many and harming both our faith and democracy. (Christian nationalism strongly influenced the Jan. 6, 2021, riot in Washington, D.C.) Our speakers will present this dangerous development, explaining what "Christian Nationalism" is and why it matters, and exploring who's involved in Christian nationalism, what are its components, and ways we can respond.

Pastor Rolf Olson, retired Lutheran pastor, and Dr. Nancy Koester, Lutheran pastor and Luther Seminary professor, will lead this fascinating, and disturbing, conversation about our national life together.

Habitat for Humanity Home Builds St. John's Volunteer Day Saturday, February 25

Five homes are being built for families in Faribault and Habitat for Humanity needs our help!

Partner families are selected by three main criteria: a need for housing, the ability to partner with Habitat in sweat equity (building with the volunteers on their own house or the house of another partner family), and the ability to pay an affordable mortgage when the build is complete.

Saturday, February 25, is St. John's "volunteer day" for the home build projects. Minnesota FoodShare March Campaign



The Greater Minneapolis Council of Churches (GMCC) Minnesota FoodShare Campaign gets underway on February 27 and continues through April 9. The FoodShare began its work in 1982 with a campaign advanced by congregations to restock food shelves in the seven-county Twin Cities metropolitan area. Because the effort was so successful and the need so great, the March campaign became a state-wide program and now is in its 42nd year.
