From Our Pastors

Dear people of St. John's,

As I write this, I'm looking forward to Christmas Day.

Yes, as a pastor, I do look forward to Christmas Day as a bit of a finish line – the last big worship service of the busy fall and winter seasons.

But here at St. John's, I look forward so much to the **community** that gathers on Christmas Day for dinner in St. John's Hall. When I came to Northfield ten years ago, I was astonished that St. John's could pull this off – a meal for 200 or so people, served by volunteers taking time out from their own family celebrations, with every bit of food donated by individuals. *People still do that?*!

In the middle of 2020, we wondered whether this beautiful tradition could come back. We weren't sure, after a pandemic hiatus and with some of the first leaders of the tradition less involved, that there would be will and resources to do it again.

But here we are, three years later, and every volunteer slot is filled. Families have planned their holiday around taking this time together in community. Community members from beyond St. John's tell me they look forward to joining us that day.

Yes, there are people who join us for Christmas dinner because they might not get a good meal at home otherwise. But more than that, many come because *community* is something they genuinely long for. Some will talk to strangers; some will mostly sit with their families; some will sit in a corner and just be glad to enjoy the buzz of human beings and the light in the Hall windows around them.

As we enter 2024, I hold this day as a reminder that the hard work of community building is important; in fact, it can be life-saving.

Church community – through meals, programs, worship, small groups, choirs, Stephen minsters, and social times – is one of the few places left in our society where we see our obligations to each other as more than a transaction. Church is also one of the few places where – if we are willing – we can share the whole of our lives, across generations. While we don't always have all the data to prove our worth, or brandbuilding to shout from the rooftops, the hard work of community is one of the most unique witnesses we can give to God's desire for a mended world.

Thank you for being part of this vital witness! Happy New Year!

Our Education/Justice Committee welcomed the Northfield community to be enlightened by local, state and national speakers and experts on a variety of current justice issues: Courageous Conversations. Our topics:

Our Stewardship Committee brought us "Mission Morning" with 60 women in attendance. Our Lenten Book read takes a deep dive into the Jewish context of the New Testaments with Amy-Jill Levine's *The Misunderstood Jew: The Church and the Scandal of the Jewish Jesus*.

Levine is a widely noted Jewish scholar of the New Testament and the author of *Light of the World*, which we read during Advent. In *The Misunderstood Jew* Levine seeks to undo longstanding Christian misunderstandings of Jesus's relationship to Jews and Judaism in the conviction that this will help strengthen relationships between Jews and Christians today.



Book discussions will be held on Sundays at 9:45 a.m. and Wednesday afternoons at 4:15 p.m. beginning on Sunday, February 18 (continuing Sundays, February 25, March 3, 10; Wednesdays, February 21, 28, March 6, 13).
