From Our Pastors

Dear Friends in Christ.

In the last couple of years, our Church Council devotions have been centering around a common book read. In 2025, we selected Martin Luther King Jr's collection of sermons *Strength to Love*.

Over and over again, we were struck by how these words from over 50 years ago still ring as prophetic words for us today. King's truth-telling to the church about what it means to witness to Christ's love in the face of unjust powers was in constant conversation with Scripture. His language is occasionally dated, but much of what he says about the forces that were at work to sustain segregation still rings true now. One of the reasons for that is that – unlike so many "church books" written today – *Strength to Love* is sermons, focused on interpreting Scripture.

This year, we are turning to another book that is decades old, yet still eerily accurate at describing the shape of our world: Walter Brueggemann's *The Prophetic Imagination*, first published in 1978. Brueggemann died last year and is remembered as one of the most formative scholars of the Old Testament of his generation, taking the dry historical approaches of the previous generation to a broader audience by understanding the varied voices of the Old Testament as diverse testimonies to God's work.

Brueggemann's work was instrumental in the theology of the late Dan Erlander, the Lutheran pastor whose illustrated Bible overview *Manna and Mercy* is our textbook for teaching catechism and confirmation students about the story of God.

In turn, Dan Erlander's work was instrumental in bringing the Rev. Alan Storey, a South African Methodist pastor, to teach in the United States. Northfield will be one stop in Alan Storey's visit to the U.S. this April. He brings his personal experience from the struggle against apartheid and ongoing work for reconciliation in South Africa to his passionate preaching and biblical teaching.

We are woven into a grand tradition of people who have sought to understand what it means to read the Bible in *our* time. As this new year begins, we invite you to read, to discuss, and, as Karl Barth said, to take the Bible in one hand and the newspaper in the other. In so doing, we keep trying to understand what Jesus meant when he said:

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set free those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

Save the Date... Manna and Mercy Retreat with Rev. Alan Storey, April 24-25, 2026

South African pastor Alan Storey is returning to St. John's to lead a Manna and Mercy Retreat on Friday evening, April 24, through Saturday, April 25. Alan came to St. John's in the fall of 2016 to lead



this retreat, which had a lasting impact for many in our community. Alan is an ordained elder of the United Methodist Church of South Africa and is appointed to the Central Methodist Mission (CMM) in Cape Town.

His commitment to the peacemaking Jesus was tested early in life when he faced conscription into the apartheid regime's military. After spending a year of discernment working in Australia, he returned to South Africa, declaring

he would never fight in the apartheid army – or any army. He was arrested and faced trial with a six-year prison sentence as the likely outcome. Alan's trial was abandoned, and he became the last conscientious objector to be tried in apartheid South Africa.

The Bible is meant to be an instrument of God to enable abundant life for God's creation. Sadly, through the ages it has been read and interpreted in such a way that it has been used as an instrument of human domination and death—to cheer on the crusades, support slavery, advocate Apartheid, glorify genocide, sanction sexism, bless war and worship prosperity in the face of the poor, just to name just a few horrors of our human history. During the Manna and Mercy retreat, we will take a fresh look at scripture through the interpretive lens of Jesus' life, death and resurrection and God's overall call for each one of us to partner with God in mending this fractured world. The hope is that after we have done so, our interpretations and use of the scriptures will be truly liberating and life-enabling.

Using Daniel Erlander's book *Manna and Mercy* (a book we use for Confirmation here at St. John's), Alan Storey will take us on a journey



from Genesis to Revelation over the course of two days, with sensitivity to the contexts in which the scriptures were written and of our present day. We hope you will join us for this event!

Alan will be leading and speaking at other events in Northfield that week, which may interest you.

Pub Theology in January


What is Pub Theology?
