

From Our Pastors

Dear Friends in Christ:

Who is my neighbor? This question, posed to Jesus, makes all the difference when we think about God's commandments. Love your neighbor as yourself, the commandments says, but it seems to be our human nature to want to draw lines around the circle of neighborliness.

For the last three years, many of us have found our circles getting pretty small. While we might still pray for peace around the world, we haven't traveled the world. While we might still consider that stranger at the grocery store a neighbor, we've been less likely to talk to them. Even by the standard definition of a neighbor as someone who lives on your block, we might find that we know the names of fewer of our neighbors than before 2020.

This spring, St. John's members will be invited in a variety of ways to learn about and serve their neighbors.

- We are welcoming dozens of new neighbors into our congregation with the first Accompany class since 2020.
- The Women of the ELCA will have a day celebrating how we serve our global neighbors through Lutheran World Relief mission projects such as quilts, school kits, and baby kits and baby wear.
- Our youth will spend the post-Easter weeks learning about our neighbors of other faiths, including field trips to a synagogue and a mosque. There's nothing like sitting with a fellow student during Ramadan to open ones eyes to the way your neighbors live out their faith on a daily basis.
- And on Trinity Sunday, we'll celebrate the ways our knitters surround our neighbors with prayer through their ministry of prayer shawls. Their work reminds us that we are never alone in God's fabric of care; we are knit together in ways we don't always see.


When Jesus answered the question "who is my neighbor?" he surprised his listeners by telling a story about a despised Samaritan being the one who obeyed God's commandment. *Neighbor is as neighbor does*, he seemed to say. Facing Something Heavy?

Lent is a heavy season. During these weeks we consider things dark and somber. We pray to confess our own weakness and sin. We find ourselves encountering loss and emptiness. We face death and dying. But we also open ourselves to one another and to hope as Lent collapses into the promise of Easter's new life.

Recently St. John's High School Youth Group took on the heavy Lenten topic of death and dying. They talked about how our culture both protects us from encounters with death and provides various media experiences with it; they shared photos and stories about loved ones who have died; they learned about how and why we Christians have funerals; and they also visited a local funeral home.

Stephen Ministers often are called to face death with their care receivers: a long past death, an approaching death, or the idea of dying. Together they look honestly at tough realities, believing yet questioning as people of faith. Together they seek the comfort of God's life-giving love.
