

Blessing Box at St. John's

"Take something if in need; leave something when blessed."



The congregation of St. John's continues to support the "Blessing Box", a mission that started in the fall of 2017. It is similar to the Little Libraries found around town except the Blessing box is filled with donated non-perishable food and personal hygiene products. The idea is that anyone who may be struggling can use the goods to make ends meet. The community is welcome to donate to the box being mindful of Minnesota's temperature changes. Donation Ideas (please check expiration dates): canned goods, pasta, flour, sugar, coffee, crackers, soap, mittens, toothbrush, baby items, such as diapers and pacifiers. The box is located in the drive-up on the north side of St. John's.

From Our Pastors

One of my pastoral colleagues related recently that a member of his church complained about his preaching. This man was tired of hearing that God is love. He urged the pastor to preach more about how people should be living their lives if they were following Jesus.

Rather than engage this man in a debate faith versus works, the pastor agreed. The next Sunday, he preached about "Jesus' second most favorite topic": money, and Jesus' hard words for those who have a lot of wealth and possessions. Needless to say, this wasn't exactly what his parishioner had in mind. (Maybe he wanted to hear how *other* people should be following Jesus).

The truth is, Jesus did not separate the question of how we steward our resources from how we love God and our neighbors. In the book of Acts, the one thing that most hinders the spread of the Gospel is not language or diverse backgrounds or identities. The most common hindrance to the Gospel is clinging to "silver and gold."

It's not "stewardship season" at St. John's. We are blessed to have the resources we need for ministry and, as of this month, to be debt-free. We are so blessed to have inherited a healthy congregation. But it's never a bad time to ask ourselves, collectively and individually, how we steward our resources, power, and voices to love our neighbors.

We tend to think of stewardship as only the question of what we give to charity; but our willingness to share our resources for public goods – be they national parks, protecting clean water, or educating our future leaders – is part of Christian stewardship, and our advocacy for expenditures that reflect our values is stewardship of our power in a democracy.

To take just one public resource that is under attack right now: in our legislatures hard conversations are happening about Medicaid, which is an incredibly important program for so many of our local ministry partners. Our hospital, our retirement homes, Laura Baker Services, and many other institutions could not function the same if Medicaid resources are cut. Half of long-term care costs in Minnesota come from Medicaid. Half of substance abuse disorder treatments come from Medicaid. 41% of the state's kids are covered by medical assistance in Minnesota. If you know someone with dementia, or an addiction, or a disability, or a child with a health condition, odds are good Medicaid affects YOU.

We're going to keep preaching that God is love at St. John's; and we'll also ask, "HOW is that love being enacted in my community?"





April Visit to Global Health Ministries

A team of 8 volunteers drove up to GHM on Tuesday, April 1, bringing donations provided by the generous people of St. John's: 565 rolled bandages, 34 quilts, 2 blankets, 7 pillow cases, and 9 twin sheets. These items will be delivered in shipments to Lutheran hospitals and clinics primarily in Africa where the need is greatest.

We completed several tasks during our 3 hours of volunteering, toured the facility, and heard from Scott Lien, Director of Operations, about a new partnership with Lutheran World Relief to bring help to many in need. One of our tasks was to partially fill pillowcases with gowns and drapes and tie them shut. These bundles become fill for voids between the boxes and equipment which are packed tightly into shipping containers, ensuring not only protection of the products in shipment, but also that everything in the container can be used in some way by the recipients. Our second task was possibly the





most fulfilling because we packed our donated quilts and those from other congregations into boxes that were subsequently weighed, measured and labeled with the number of quilts in preparation for shipment. The boxes they use come from donations, so they were all different sizes, but we did our best to compress the quilts to fit as many as possible into each box. We 'oohed and aahed' over each quilt we touched, thinking of the hands who made it, and the hands who would receive it.

Thank you for your generosity, enabling us to complete projects for those in need beyond our borders. Our next trip to GHM will likely be in June. Watch the church bulletin for the date and reserve your spot to participate!


