Planning Our Future Together

You are invited to participate in a series of gatherings to be held at St. John's this fall. We hope to hear from everyone as we imagine together how to build a bright future for our congregation and community.

This is a great time to do some thoughtful planning. We have all experienced such a disruption to our lives during the pandemic, and we learned new ways of doing things and formed new habits. It doesn't seem wise to assume that things will automatically return to pre-pandemic patterns. For example, we have found that some types of gatherings can work well with a remote option, allowing additional people to participate. Our building isn't set up to make that as easy as it could be, but it seems like something we should consider improving.

As another example, we want to think about the best uses of our physical space. As community gatherings resume, could St. John's Hall and our kitchen be used in new ways? Do we have other spaces that could be used more effectively or for new purposes? Even the parking lot might be reimagined as a



From Our Pastors

Dear Friends in Christ:

Occasionally I get asked by outsiders, in a very general way, how church has "handled the pandemic." The question is phrased in such a way that it sounds like they expect we had simply stopped in time, and now are trying to "get back" to some place before March of 2020.

But we know that time did not stop in 2020. Children kept growing. All of us kept getting older. People got married, people retired, people left some jobs and began others. Health situations changed. Some of you started new degree programs and, of course, many of us buried people near and dear to us. And, during all this time, some people left Northfield and other new neighbors moved in.

We are not the same community we were 30 months ago. There are many new faces among us, and other faces that look quite different than they did. In order to be church together in 2022, we need to not simply look back, but look around at who we are NOW.

These first months of the program year we will be inviting you into doing just that:

- 1. We will have "speed socials": times to quickly meet a number of people old and new, so you have somewhere to start conversations again the next time you see them.
- 2. We will have Wednesday Night Meals every week again. Take the time to break bread with someone new in St. John's Hall.
- 3. We will be starting work on a new picture directory, so we all have a reminder of the names and faces who make up St. John's now.
- 4. We will be inviting you into PEEL workshops next spring (see page 10), where you can try out seeing and being seen by someone else new.
- 5. We will invite you into conversations about our facilities and ministry going forward (see page 1), so that we can better align who we are now with the ministry God is calling us to in this time.








If you are stressed or are going through a difficult time, you may benefit from a caring listening ear.



Just bring your questions, thoughts, and experiences.




This rite follows a seven-year education and reflection program at St. John's beginning with Catechism (CAT) classes in grades three, four, and five; weekday and Sunday classes in grades six, seven, and eight; and classes, retreats, and a mentor relationship in grade nine. The program concluded with a retreat at Gustavus on Saturday, October 8. Please pray for these young people and their faith and life as they make this commitment and affirmation.

St. John's Forum - October 9

This past year, a small group from St. John's had the opportunity to experience a weekend creative workshop called "PEEL." PEEL was developed by a Christian art director in London as an experience designed to help young people creatively reflect on self-identity in a way that goes deeper than social media.

A PEEL workshop engages participants with poetry and photography experts in their respective crafts, and then invites each person to share who they are with one fellow participant. A poem and portrait is created for each person.

This coming year, St. John's has grant funding to host several more of these workshops. Come learn about the experience with the pastors and Kristin Partlo sharing their experience from this past spring.



Thanksgiving Eve Ecumenical Service at St. Peter Lutheran Church

From the Worship & Arts Board

St. John's has joined a growing number of congregations starting the practice of musical reparations. This means we acknowledge that many of our hymns or songs sung in worship are from Black and Indigenous sources who had their humanity stripped away by a Christian white majority.

We lift up that our worship and understanding of God has been enriched immeasurably by the artistic contributions of people of color for which they were never paid, and that we desire to make amends financially and through relationships and acknowledgement.

With the goal of beginning to repair our relationships on behalf of the church, the Worship & Arts Board has decided to start contributing an amount equal to our annual copyright license payment, about \$500, and this year we have made a contribution to Hopewell Music Cooperative in North. This amount will fund a semester of music lessons for a student. Hopewell is an organization with the mission of "improving access to music education in North Minneapolis through affordable, inclusive, and engaging music programs." We pray that every time we sing a hymn or anthem written by a person of color, named or unnamed, we are reminded of the blessings of art and music to transform our understanding of God and our need to make amends for the sake of our church and our neighbors.

potential resource. We know many share the desire to use energy and resources as efficiently as we can.

As the Church Council has discussed our future, we see the need to be thoughtful about our mission and ministries to do successful long range planning. We need to understand our local demographics and other community trends. And we need to hear from you.

- What are your dreams for St. John's?
- How can we use our strengths to serve our congregation and our community?
- How can we do better at promoting diversity, inclusion, and equity?
- What mission areas should be our priorities?

This fall, we will hold 3 open meetings, hoping that everyone is able to attend at least one:

- Between services on Sunday, October 2
- Between services on Sunday, October 16
- At 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday evening, October 26

All will be held in St. John's Hall. We will organize our discussions into 4 general areas:

- intentional building of relationships,
- using our facilities as a resource for mission,
- engaging the wider community, and
- stewardship of our planet, and our financial resources.

You will also be able to share your ideas by filling out an online survey or by speaking with Pastor Fickenscher or Congregation President Rod Christensen.

After hearing from everyone, we will compile our collective thoughts, find areas of consensus and new ideas to investigate, and bring a report to the annual meeting. Then, we will likely convene a special workgroup to do some deeper study and bring recommendations that include both current needs and longer term planning. The Church Council doesn't know exactly where this will lead, but we are confident that by sharing our ideas, listening to one another, and letting the Spirit guide us, we will find exciting paths to follow. - At some point in 2017 (the most recent year available), more than 40 million people in the United States were unsure where their next meal might come from.
- 39.7 million Americans were living in poverty in 2017. For a family of four, this means their annual household income was below \$25,094.




