From Our Pastors

"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God - what is good and acceptable and perfect."

Romans 12:2

Dear People of St. John's,

One of the most common questions I've gotten since being back from sabbatical is: are you glad you're back? The answer to that question is simple. Yes, I'm very glad to be back. I really have missed you and being part of the day-to-day ministries. And I am so, so grateful to have had that time away. I'm aware of what a rare opportunity it is to receive the gift of time and rest. Thank you for the opportunity to go on sabbatical.

As I have been reflecting on my sabbatical, a couple of things that surprised me. First - I had the opportunity to let go of daily details. I was present and enjoyed lots of activities and moments with my family and friends. But the noise of day-to-day thoughts simply turned off. It was quite startling actually, and I was a little afraid my brain wouldn't turn back on again, but it did thankfully. It needed rest. The primary thing that I learned from that is just how tired and worn out my brain and heart were. I suspect I'm not unique in that. I bet you're tired too.

The other most surprising part of sabbatical was just how transformative it was. To be honest, I was nervous about making sabbatical impactful and worthwhile. But I can honestly say that sabbatical has helped me to discover and make some of the most needed transformation in my life. It really felt like a time that (in the words of Paul) was the "renewing of my mind" and my heart.

Here's a snapshot of the transformation:

- I discovered a love for Pickleball. For years, I have struggled with getting regular exercise and now I am!
- Practicing meditating in silence for 10 minutes today. Using the app "Insight Timer", I try to sit in silence for 10 minutes with the *only goal* of clearing my mind. Thoughts do enter in, but I try to just let them float by.
- I enjoyed reading the Bible...for fun. My goal was to read all 12 books of the Minor Prophets in the Old Testament and I did it! Using Enterthebible.org, I read some history and background on each book before I read it, which enriched my understanding of the Biblical story.

These practices have helped me see and feel the effects they can have on one's mental health and spiritual well-being. Don't get me wrong, these habits have waxed and waned, but they have also showed me that change is possible and that small transformations in one's life can have a big impact. I wonder – if there is a change you could make in your life, what would it be?

Alongside these new habits, my family and I had some wonderful unique experiences during this time. We went on a two-week trip to Scotland, where we discovered our love of Scottish culture, the abundant warmth and hospitality of Scottish people, sticky toffee pudding, and the roadside harry coos. **From Our Pastors**

God Is Coming!

Winter's short, chilly days take a toll on us - our health, our spirit, and often our patience. Time with loved ones offers support, joy, and sanity. Our faith does, too, especially during this dark season. Of course we acknowledge God's presence all year: when we pray, when we gather for worship, in bread and wine. As people of faith we feel God with us wherever we celebrate and whenever we mourn. But at this time of year poignant hymns whisper the very good news that God actually shows up in our dark, disappointing, grimy lives: "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel"; "He Comes to Us as One Unknown"; "Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming".

The gospels explain that God *came* to us - at night, in a cave, in anxious times - and as a baby! This shocking, child-friendly story feels almost like a dare. Do you doubt for even a moment that God will find you wherever you are? Are you worried that your needs are too great for God to step in and be with you? "Fear not!" the angels said. God is on the way. God knows you and what you need. God really is coming!

Stephen Ministers are trained to assure their care receivers that the God they yearn for is coming to them. It may be a God of peace and joy, a God of reconciliation and forgiveness, a God of unconditional love, or a God who is simply there in a crisis. How about you? Are you yearning for God? What kind of God do you need? If you or someone you know yearns to hear that God is coming, talk with a pastor at 507-645-4429 about connecting with a Stephen Minister.

Five homes are being built for families in Faribault and Habitat for Humanity needs our help!
