

### **Blessing Box at St. John's**

The congregation of St. John's continues to support the "Blessing Box", a mission that started in the fall of 2017. It is similar to the Little Libraries found around town except the Blessing box is filled with donated non-perishable food and personal hygiene products. The idea is that anyone who may be struggling can use the goods to make ends meet. The community is welcome to donate to the box being mindful of Minnesota's temperature changes. Donation Ideas (please check expiration dates): canned goods, pasta, flour, sugar, coffee, crackers, soap, mittens, toothbrush, baby items, such as diapers and pacifiers. The box is located in the drive-up on the north side of St. John's.

#### **From Our Pastors**

Dear Friends in Christ.

At the Southeastern Minnesota Synod Assembly, Bishop Hassanally lifted up this statistic:

In 2023, there were 330 pastoral vacancies in the ELCA that typically are filled by first-call (that is, new seminary graduate) candidates; in the same year, the church had 150 students starting the candidacy process.

What this means is that many congregations will need to think about doing ministry without a full-time ordained pastor at the helm. This scenario is not entirely new, especially in rural settings; but it in 2024 it is a new normal that is changing how the ELCA thinks about leadership and congregational life.

Here at St. John's, we are fortunate to have the size and resources to fund at least two pastoral positions. In today's ELCA, that scenario is increasingly uncommon. Yet we are also at a size where a lot of work has to be done by people other than pastors. There are simply too many homebound members, too many people who might go through a crisis, too many programs that need tending, too many people in need of pastoral care for the work to be done by pastors alone. It's not only a matter of economics; the work of the church is sometimes done best by people with different skill sets than your typical pastor.

Sometimes I hear people talk about whether "the church" showed up for them in a time of need. Here at St. John's, I'm grateful that "the church" shows up with many different faces, in many different ways, to care for one another. We have staff who bring a range of gifts and training to bear on their work. Stephen Ministers give hundreds of hours of time listening and praying with others. Adults and young adults serving with youth take time to lead small groups, chaperone mission trips, and share their own faith. Knitters make prayer shawls, with every stitch a petition for the wellness of the recipient. Cooks make a hot meal for those who might be too stretched in budget or in time to eat well otherwise. Women of the ELCA gather others for study and courageous conversations about the hardest questions of being a person of faith today. We are so blessed to have a community that does not consider faith to be a spectator sport.


"The Church" is the whole people of God. When YOU show up for one another, you are *being* St. John's for each other.

We as your pastors take our turn in listening, holding hands and praying in times of crisis; and we are charged with feeding you weekly from the Word and Jesus' table. But as we say at the end of communion every week: You ARE the body of Christ. Go now, fed and forgiven, to BE good news for the world. Thank you for being a people who show up for each other and for all God's beloved world.


### **Summer Worship Schedule**

Beginning on June 3, Pub Theology will return to its weekly schedule (except for a few here and there), Mondays from 6:00-7:30 p.m.







St. John's Women hosted 140 women from 39 churches in our Cannon River Conference on May 11th.

**Judy Swanson**, long-time member of St. John's, was honored at the Cannon River Conference on May 11, 2024. She designed the Cannon River Conference logo & banner that was adopted and has been used for many years. Judy explains the meaning behind the design:

"What a glorious symbol we women of the ELCA have adopted. The beautiful water lily that gracefully cranes and dances upward through the water, toward the sunlight, while always anchored in nourishing soil, and

thriving in and depending on the waters around it.

So too, do we live in water - our baptismal waters. So too, are we led in the light and made beautiful by God's grace. There we bask in God's love which nourishes and sustains us all of our lives. So too, are we anchored, firmly rooted in our faith in Jesus Christ."



"We can rightfully claim this lovely flower as our own. The white water lily is found along lake shores all over the state of Minnesota. In particular the American Lotus Lily grows in shallow lakes and marshes along the Mississippi River, specifically between Saint Paul and the Iowa border. That's our area - the rivers, valleys, fields, pastures and woodlands of Southeastern Minnesota synod.


The five water lilies represent the five conferences of the Southeastern Minnesota Synod - Blue Earth River, Cannon River, Minnesota River, Root River and Zumbro River."

She also designed the national WELCA logo:

"Our logo - with a cross, water and a white lily - Identifies women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America as children of God; baptized, forgiven, adopted into God's family, full of grace and hope in eternal life. It is a reminder of the growth, beauty, and vitality that rises out of that life-giving baptismal water. It is also a reminder of the mission of the church as stated in Matthew 28:19, "Go, therefore,

make disciples of all nations; baptize them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

This logo is used on the WELCA website, posters, banners, stationary and articles of clothing! WELCA even sells jewelry with Judy's design on it! Judy was gifted a silver necklace with the WELCA logo on it for all her work on these two beautiful designs.

#### St. John's Music Interns

The music internship program at St. John's began in 2013 with an idea to have paid singers from St. Olaf College sing with the St. John's Chorale. The hope was that these singers could contribute to the music making of the choir, but the choir itself could offer hands-on vocational training to these future music educators, church musicians, and soloists. The program has been steadily continuing for ten years. In the 2023–2024 season we had four interns with the Chorale and one with our handbell choir, Rejoice Ringers.

While most of their work happens behind the scenes in our weekly rehearsals or in the balcony on Sunday mornings, this program has truly been life-giving to music at St. John's. It's exciting to see these students become a part of our choir family each year. In addition to adding their voices to the Chorale, they can also experience conducting, accompanying hymns and anthems, and singing solos. Our congregation has strong ties with the music at St. Olaf (going way back to the days when F. Melius Christiansen was organist), and my hope is that this program allows us to continue that relationship.

In 2013 when John Ferguson, as Interim Director of Worship, Music & Arts, introduced this idea, the funding was made possible from a small amount from the estate of Dr. Alice Hanson. Dr. Hanson was a distinguished professor of music at St. Olaf as well as a devoted member of the Chorale. She embodied this connection between St. John's and St. Olaf. Now years later, this program continues through ongoing financial gifts to the Alice Hanson Education Fund, named in her memory. I am grateful for the gifts given to this fund and welcome any future gifts that help us continue this program.



### "HOPE IS A MUSCLE" Affirmations A Land Acknowledgment Thank You to St. John's from the WELCA Board

The inspiration for our monthly Courageous Conversations took seed in 2017, as our country was facing deep divisions and a disturbing

resurgence of hate crimes. We felt the need to resist these forces by raising awareness and activism around justice issues, and amplifying the voices of those who have been marginalized. Hearing these stories over the past seven years has often inspired us to act, though these actions can feel small and inconsequential. It is a rare gift to get a glimpse of real impact as we did a few weeks ago.



Our April Courageous Conversations speaker was Dr. Kelly Sherman-Conroy, on the topic, "From Trauma to Triumph, a Lakota Perspective." Dr. Kelly, a Lutheran pastor and theologian, spoke of how her Native spirituality and her Christian upbringing and faith were complementary and intertwined. She shared her struggles as well as pride in becoming the first native woman in the ELCA to earn a PhD in theology. As the Q&A began, a young woman from another town stepped up to the mike and thanked the speaker in the Dakota language. Then, in English, with great emotion and a hand over her heart said, "You have spoken to my soul." She briefly shared her struggle with her faith and identity as an adopted child brought up in a very conservative white church. In reclaiming her native identity, she walked away from the church that no longer spoke to her. It was clear that Dr. Kelly's weaving of the Lakota spirituality with her Christian faith was a profound awakening for her.

She later returned to the microphone to thank St. John's for the Land Acknowledgment sign that had greeted her and her sister at the door, and for including that acknowledgment in the opening welcome. She said that she had been to many churches and had never seen or heard such a statement...and that they had never felt so welcomed.

This was followed by a St. John's member who stepped up to the microphone to share her story about her grandmothers and others in her ancestry who had endured great suffering and loss at the boarding schools, and whose genealogy records tied her to the speaker.

These riveting testimonials were a wonderful, visceral affirmation for the power of small actions. By amplifying voices that have too often been silenced, and acknowledging past harm (with a sign and a statement), we give space for "the other" to be heard, and in the process we allow ourselves to be changed (you could have heard a pin drop in a roomful of 92 people!).

There is much work yet to be done, but we are grateful to be part of a women's group...and a whole congregation...that is not afraid to use muscle to bring hope for a better world.
