

Thank you so very much for recognizing and celebrating my 10 years here at St. John's in May! It is very hard to believe that so much time has passed. I can remember so clearly how excited I was to be called to St. John's, and truth be told, that excitement has not worn off. I feel immensely grateful each week I get to serve here with a fantastic staff and with a generous and encouraging congregation.

- 5. All the Courageous Conversations With the help of the Women of St. John's, our congregation has bravely and helpfully been at the forefront of many needed conversations around race, immigration, gender and sexuality, mental health, and native indigenous communities.
- 6. Late Night Christmas Eve Worship There is just nothing like serving communion to beloved people at 11:55 p.m. on Christmas Eve.
- 7. Canoeing Through Thunderstorms I love going on youth trips, and a favorite moment was watching young people show great leadership during a panicked moment while canoeing through a thunderstorm.
- 8. Baptism and Communion I have been profoundly shaped by worship at St. John's over these past 10 years, especially around baptisms and communion. Pastor Pam and Nathan, specifically, have opened my faith to a richer, deeper, and more meaningful understanding of these sacraments.

From the Benevolence & Social Concerns Board

The Benevolence & Social Concerns Board has a discretionary budget of \$35,000 for distribution in 2025. During our monthly meetings, we consider current needs and determine which organizations will receive a gift from our congregation and what the amount will be. We have distributed funds since the beginning of the year as follows: \$1,000 each to Global Refuge (formerly known as Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service), Lutheran Social Services, and two local organizations: Community Action Center and Northfield Union of Youth/The Key. In addition, we sent \$2,000 each to Lutheran Disaster Relief (for California wildfire relief) and Health Finders.

Moving forward, we will endeavor to update the congregation monthly via *The Voice* to share where your benevolence dollars are going. Our goal is to provide financial support to two organizations each month; one local and one global. For the month of May, we selected Lutheran World Relief (LWR) and Healthy Community Initiative (HCI): TORCH program to receive gifts. Each organization will receive \$2,000. Gifts made to LWR prior to June 30 are matched, which doubles our donation. LWR works around the world to tackle global poverty by helping people to adapt to the challenges that threaten their livelihoods and well-being. The HCI:TORCH program (Tackling Obstacles and Raising College Hopes) mission is to support and empower students in graduating from high school and pursuing future goals, with an intentional focus on Northfield's students of color, youth from low income families, and first-generation college attendees.

Please note that the B&SC \$35,000 discretionary budget is only a portion of the money that St. John's shares to extend our mission of proclaiming Christ as hope and love in the world.

Stephen Ministry: Care for Other Care Providers

St. John's Stephen Ministers visit regularly with their care receivers. How these pairs interact might have a routine or vary depending on the care receiver's need that day. Their time together occasionally includes a simple activity, but a quiet conversation is always key - with the Stephen Minister's priority being to listen.

Many, but not all, care receivers have time with friends and family members, too. Those others may provide either brief visits or major actual caregiving. A neighbor or friend could offer limited care for a short time – after a minor accident or illness – while a spouse or adult child commits to more long-term support when the situation requires it. Stephen Ministers are alert to the possible needs of their care receivers' other care providers as well. Being available 24-7 takes a toll on long-term providers so they also may appreciate a Stephen Minister.

If you or someone you know, including a weary care provider, would benefit from time with a Stephen Minister, contact one of the pastors at 507-645-4429.

- What's Needed: Lunches for all volunteers, partner families, and our construction crew.
- Habitat Provides: Tables, serving utensils, bottled water, and electrical hookups.
- Sign Up and Waiver: The Sign Up Genius for volunteering can be found on the Rice County Habitat for Humanity website (www.habitatricecounty.org). Everyone that comes to the site will need to fill out a waiver (also available on the website) ONCE a year.

Whether it's a home-cooked meal, takeout, or a combination of both, every lunch is appreciated. Some popular options include sandwiches, pasta dishes, tacos, or fried chicken. Our **150th anniversary** celebrations began Saturday, May 10th with a delightful brunch and program. We were treated to delightful music by Rhonda Reece (piano), Ruth Aasang (flute), Jane Rinehart (cello), and Christina Schwietz (soprano). JoAnn Kleber and Jane Rinehart entertained us with delightful stories of St. John's women from our past. Women who served as president on the executive board and as president of the congregation were recognized and given roses.



From the very beginning, St. John's Women have been involved in stewardship projects. From buying clothing for children so they could be baptized to supporting missionaries, to baking cookies for servicemen and so much more, St. John's Women have shared what

they could with those in need. We have just begun to scratch the surface of what the archives can tell us about those activities. We have uncovered statistics in the minutes, etc. from 1987 to today and in just those 38 years women have donated:

1,794 baby layettes 692 personal care kits 357 children's sweaters 1720 rolled bandages 95 prayer shawls 13 baptismal blankets 100 hospital sheets 48 book bags 78 pairs of mittens 184 hospice kits 1,706 school kits 2,495 quilts 66 sewing kits From the archives

225 Kits Packed on Mission Morning

32 St. John's women gathered for a productive and enjoyable Mission Morning on Saturday April 26. A total of 225 baby care kits, newborn kits, personal care kits, and hospice kits were packed; 3 quilts were assembled; and 174 bandages rolled. Rev. Lisa Kipp, Lutheran World Relief Dir. of Congregational Engagement, inspired us with her words and videos of how the kits are used in places of need around the world, including in the Carolinas after the damaging storms last spring. One surprising fact was that 35 quilts are compressed into a bundle for shipping by a compactor specially designed just for this purpose by engineering students at the U of MN about 40 years ago. Rev. Kipp has been in Tanzania when these bundles are unpacked in the villages. Everything is valued. Even the heavy plastic bags holding the quilts are saved to use for harvesting crops. Thanks to the St. John's women who packed the kits, the men who assisted us, all who made donations to fund the project, and those who obtained Thrivent grants.



St. John's Women support Global Health Ministries by providing bandages, hospice and baby kits. Several times each year some of us volunteer at the GHM warehouse. The ministry held their annual fund raising gala on Friday, April 25th with many St. John's members in attendence, including Jane Rinehart, Sara Bright, Pam Groves-Gaggioli, Margie O'Laughlin, Dawn Tommerdahl, and Rob Quanbeck. Emcees were Greta Grosch and father, Ken Grosch, who was the first executive director of GHM. The evening's musical

entertainment was provided by Sarah Renner and Friends, all music worship leaders from around the Twin Cities. According to Mary Brown, Director of Philanthropy, they raised \$150,000+ and donations were still coming in. With more than 300 people in attendance this was their biggest fundraiser to date.

St. John's Music Interns

The music internship program at St. John's began in 2013 with an idea to have paid singers from St. Olaf College sing with the St. John's Chorale. The hope was that these singers could contribute to the music making of the choir, but the choir itself could offer hands-on vocational training to these future music educators, church musicians, and soloists. The program has been steadily continuing each year. In the 2024–25 season we had four interns with the Chorale and one with our handbell choir, Rejoice Ringers.

While most of their work happens behind the scenes in our weekly rehearsals or in the balcony on Sunday mornings, this program has truly been life-giving to the music at St. John's. It's exciting to see these students become a part of our choir family each year. In addition to adding their voices to the Chorale, they can also experience conducting, accompanying hymns and anthems, and singing solos. Our congregation has strong ties with the music at St. Olaf (going way back to the days when F. Melius Christiansen was organist), and my hope is that this program allows us to continue that relationship.

To support this program and these students, I welcome your gifts to the Alice Hanson Education Fund. Dr. Alice Hanson was a distinguished professor of music at St. Olaf as well as a devoted member of the Chorale, and she embodied the connection between St. John's and St. Olaf. Her estate provided the initial funding for this program, and ongoing financial gifts to the fund named in her memory allow us to continue this ministry. I am grateful for your gifts and all the ways you support our students, both here at church and in their lives and events at St. Olaf.


Pub Theology in June


