

### **From Our Pastors**

Dear Friends in Christ:

You just never know what impact your actions will have.

I spend a lot of time thinking about how to impart what's important and pass it on. For every sermon the question isn't just what to say but how to say it. For all our planning at church, the question isn't just what we want to teach about the faith but how to create the space and community for learning.

And yet, despite all our planning, there are times when you feel that your message has fallen on deaf ears. The usual ways we measure our success -- attendance, engagement, excitement, and positive feedback - can leave us wondering whether it's even possible to have a lasting impact on someone's life.

My family took a camping trip to the Boundary Waters early in June, and besides being a delightful time of family reconnection, I had a powerful reminder that you hardly ever see what your impact is right in the moment. When our kids were in their early teens, there wasn't much enthusiasm for family togetherness. And some of the things Will and I like to do the most were deemed boring, or worse. But on this trip, as we shared memories of previous vacations and shared the tasks of a wilderness trip with now-capable adults, we saw that those experiences *did* have a profound impact on who they are becoming now. Sometimes they even thank us for it.

In the community of faith, we measure effectiveness in decades, not minutes. We measure community by hundreds of small kind actions that add up to relationships that change us. We measure our excellence by the way we reflect the diversity of God's good creation and the delight we take in one another. Our math stretches out well beyond what we can see now and into a future that we know God holds. You just never know what impact you have on another person, but you sure can walk forward in faith. And occasionally, as happened this past Sunday when high school graduates talked about St. John's being a place where they were steadily loved and cared for, you get confirmation that the small things have added up.

Whether it is parenting or politics, we are up against big societal forces that seem to be pulling us away from each other, from the values of honesty and kindness and generosity that we hold dear. It is easy to imagine that there is no way that something as humble as *church* could make much of a dent in the mountain of hostility we see around us. But that is where faith comes in.

We will keep inviting you into walking forward with the gifts of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, kindness, gentleness, peace, goodness, faithfulness, and self-control. These are the gifts our world needs for healing.




### LOVING OUR NEIGHBORS - THROUGH GLOBAL HEALTH MINISTRIES

A few of us delivered quilts, baby kits, and hospice kits to Global Health Ministries on Tuesday, June 3rd. It's a bit of a trek from St. Johns to their Fridley warehouse, but there's always plenty to see, learn, and do once we get there. Nancy, Andi, Nan, Pam, and Jane were set to the task of packaging supplies for shipment to Tanzania. GHM sends life-giving medical supplies and equipment to Lutheran hospitals and clinics in 16 African, Central American, and Indian countries.

GHM founder Dr. John Tosa was volunteering on the same day we were, and offered these thoughts on how the non-profit organization is at work in the world today. He said, "Most people in this country weren't aware of how heavily the Ministers of Health in Africa were subsidized by USAID. The areas that have been devastated by the funding cuts are malaria and HIV/AIDS prevention, and maternal healthcare. GHM receives no federal funding, operating entirely through institutional and private donors -- but we will still be affected. The demand for our services is expected to surge, as those hospitals, clinics, and community outreach programs that depended on USAID funding cease to exist." ### Quotations Found in St. John's Women's Reports and Meeting Minutes



Trom 1898 to 1940, 31 Norwegian suppers were served and the women netted \$5,500 from these projects. (Cost \$.15) The members of the congregation and citizens of Northfield enjoyed these suppers and clamored for them yearly. The women did not count what the suppers cost them in drudgery. They enjoyed helping others and not least enjoyed working for the church. But with the passing of the years, the interests and energies of the women waned. Finally high prices, lack of space, intervention of World Wars I & II and inability to get supplies because of food rationing, brought a halt to the Norwegian suppers."

- \*\* "Alumni lunches, as they were called, (in reality picnic suppers) were served on the campus lawn to the St. Olaf alumni at commencement time, for nine consecutive years from 1910-1918. And then, too, dishes, coffee pots and other utensils needed, had to be brought up from our own kitchen. All the food was donated. Few had cars in those days and I am sure many of the women walked across town with their contributions. The menu consisted of such dishes that could be prepared at home and served easily."
- Article IV of the 1927 Ladies Aid constitution states that "the refreshments (for the meetings) shall consist of coffee, sandwiches, and one kind of cake."
- "In celebration of its 100th anniversary the St.John's ALCW put out its Centennial Cookboook. Between its gold covers are many wonderful recipes and ideas for serving." Cookbooks were available for \$3.25 in the church office, the banks in Northfield, Dundas & Dennison. The cookbook was 238 pages & contained 687 recipes!!




### From the Benevolence & Social Concerns Board

With gratitude for the financial support by the St. John's Foundation, the B&SC board is carrying out a project to recognize and thank the many in our church community who offer their time and talents through ministry and volunteerism, to grow and enhance our congregational life as well as in service to all those in need beyond St. John's.

For context, it has been ten years since our current St. John's logo was created. While you see our logo on communications and around the church, it may be helpful to know the intention and meaning behind the design. The logo was designed to be a visual expression of St. John's. Here is a portion of the original description:

Central to the design is the Greek cross, already familiar to the congregation, silhouetted by an abstract interpretation of the unique stained-glass chancel window at St. John's. The individual elements of this abstraction form a circular mosaic, symbolic of the earth and the global community. These same elements move out beyond the edges of the circle, representing our call to embrace and extend God's beauty in the world.



We will be offering t-shirts as a thank you to all who serve in ministry or volunteer capacity as a means of building connection and community and spreading St. John's message beyond our building. Our hope is that you will wear them when you volunteer or at St. John's events...or just out running errands. What we wouldn't want is for a shirt to sit at the bottom of a dresser drawer.

We will be handing out shirts at church late July/early August for those wanting one. Date TBD but likely after a Sunday service.

Also, we will be offering shirts and sweatshirts for purchase sometime this fall. Details to come.
