

From Our Pastors

Dear Friends in Christ.

Thank you for your support of our ministry with youth and families here at St. John's. As I write this, I am fresh off of our annual summer youth trip. Alongside Kristin Partlo, I helped lead a trip to Camp Amnicon, where 37 of us (6 adults and 31 youth) spent the week camping and canoeing on the Flambeau and Brule rivers in Wisconsin. For 55 years, Camp Amnicon has been guiding people on wilderness adventure trips like ours to experience growth and grace in the wild places of God's creation.

If my memory serves me, this is my 6th trip through Camp Amnicon and as always, I found *this* trip to be full of meaning and spiritual growth.

The devotional theme for the week was centered around the "fruits of the Spirit." In Galatians 5:22, the Apostle Paul writes, "the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." Each one of us was invited to consider which fruit of the Spirit is strong in our life, and then to consider which fruit could use some attention and focus during our week on the river. I wonder which ones you would have picked for yourself at this moment in time.

What I appreciated about this theme is that the fruits of the Spirit were not something we were supposed to produce (pun intended) throughout our time together. There was no external pressure to be more peaceful or kind or faithful to simply prove to others that we were connected to the Spirit of God. We were just invited each day to be on the lookout for these fruits among us – as a sign of the Spirit's work among us. As a sign of God's presence with us in the midst of all the joys and challenges that the wilderness can bring.

I saw deep *patience* in the Amnicon guide coming alongside a youth who was terrified of the water.

I saw *kindness* in a youth checking in on another's health and wellbeing during a rough day.

I saw joy in a group of people (who were strangers 5 days earlier) jumping hand-in-hand into Lake Superior, leading one to shout aloud "I've faced my fears this week!"

This isn't to overly glorify the trip and those of us on it. Don't get me wrong – there were parts of the trip that were hard. Really hard. There were moments when our worst selves came out at each other. Moments of personal challenges and inter-personal challenges.

But what I loved about this trip (and trips like it) is how a group of youth and adults, who don't always know each other well and sometimes are very different from each other, come together, face unpredictable challenges, and see how these fruits of the Spirit start to show up in ways and places we didn't expect. Glimpsing the fruits of the Spirit among near strangers in the wilderness leaves me wishing this way of seeing could be the norm among us in our everyday lives.

Too often in our culture, it is too easy to retreat to our corners and *not* come face to face with each other and our differences – different gifts and different challenges, to see the abundance we have in each other. These annual trips always remind me how to see the gifts we have in each other and the transformational power of spending longer amounts of time together.

At the end of the week, each participant receives a gift from Camp Amnicon – a Chi-Rho necklace. The Chi-Rho is an ancient Christian

symbol for community and Christ. It is comprised of two Greek letters. The Chi (rhymes with eye) is the cross shape, and the Rho (rhymes with go) is the P. Together they are the first two letters in *Cristos*, which means Christ. Early Christians would use the Chi-Rho as a way of identifying each other. In a world full of persecution and danger, a Chi-Rho meant they were safe with each other and that God was with them. It still means that today. The pendants are made of pewter, which is an amalgam of



many different kinds of metals, just as our communities are formed of many kinds of people. You may see me wearing mine in worship from time to time.

I pray that the fruits of this trip will branch out into the lives of each participant and into the lives of our faith community – you. Many thanks to all the hands it took to make this trip possible and thank you for all the ways you support adventures like this one that shape us each year.

I close with the blessing spoken over us by Amnicon staff before we headed to the river and before we departed for home:

Peace, before you Peace, behind you Peace, under your feet

Peace, within you Peace, over you Let all around you be peace.



She works with the program Justicia y Vida, a program of the IELCO which promotes the protection and education of human rights and works toward the reconciliation of peace following the 50-year civil war, and the signing of the 2016 peace accord. She has been sponsored by St. John's since 2022.

Solar Update

St. John's solar project is nearly complete!



Crews from All Solar Energy working through June installed solar panels on portions of the flat roof over the Library, Commons, and St. John's Hall. The panels are ballasted so that no drilling in the roof membrane was necessary.

As of this writing (July 25), we

are waiting for a final electrical part. Next steps after that will include Xcel's inspection and officially hooking up our array to the electrical grid.

Many thanks to all who gave so generously so that we could immediately start on this project without a loan! Once the project is complete, St. John's can apply for the 30% federal rebate authorized by the Inflation Reduction Act.

All Solar Energy has offered St. John's members a \$1,000 rebate plan; if you install solar with them on your own home, you receive a \$1,000 rebate, and St. John's will also receive \$1,000 back!

Math Corps

Are you looking for a way to stay engaged in the community? Do you like spending time with young kids? Become a tutor with Math Corps! There are several openings for the upcoming school year in elementary schools in Rice County. This is a great, flexible position for people of all ages with multiple options between 10 and 35 hours per week. You don't need to be a mathematician - you will be tutoring basic elementary math skills and will have training and support.

Benefits include a stipend every two weeks (up to \$1000) and an educational award (up to \$5,176) that can be transferred to a family member if you are over age 55. Health insurance and child care assistance are available for full-time members.

Candidates must be 18 years or older, be a U.S. citizen and have a H.S. diploma or GED. Must have an interest in connecting with young people and helping them thrive. For more information, go to:

Promise Fellows

Do you know a young person looking for a job this fall? There are many openings for AmeriCorps Promise Fellows in Rice County. Promise Fellows work with middle school and high school students keeping them engaged and connected. This 35 hour per week position can be an excellent opportunity for a year of service or for someone figuring out what they want to do next while building a resume.

There are many benefits of service with AmeriCorps, including an educational award upon completion of \$5,176. This money can be applied to existing loans or future tuition, room and board. During service, Promise Fellows earn a stipend of \$1,067 every two weeks. Promise Fellows are also eligible for health insurance, child care assistance and student loan forbearance.

Candidates must be 18 years or older, be a U.S. citizen and have a H.S. diploma or GED. Must have an interest in connecting with young people and helping them thrive. For more information, go to:

Exploring God in creation, growing faith in community, engaging the world as followers of Jesus

This summer, five of St. John's youth attended Good Earth Village Bible Camp in Spring Valley, MN.
