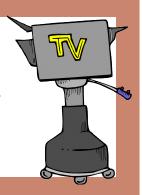

From Our Pastors

Dear people of St. John's,

As I write this article, I am just a few days away from our summer youth trip to Christikon in McLeod, Montana. By the time you are reading this — we will be back! Since 1951, Christikon has been a special place for spiritual growth and renewal with friends, old and new; an intentional Christian community where all are welcome, chosen, cherished, and loved. This year, 29 youth from St. John's, St. Peter's, and First UCC will venture out to the mountains of Montana together.

I am guessing this is my 12th summer youth trip over nearly 20 years of ministry. If you have ever been on a trip like this (either as a youth or a chaperone), you know how powerful and life-shaping they can be. I have watched trips like this fuse youth groups together into caring communities, help individuals grow in confidence and faith, and ignite life-long friendships. Sometimes it can be hard to put into words the impact a trip like this can have – but for those who were there, you can just feel the difference it makes.

In recent years, there is new evidence of the difference outdoor camp ministry can have on the lives of young people. A study called *Sacred Playgrounds* determined that the most effective camps had the following traits:

- Faith-Centered: Faith teachings and practices are intertwined in all camp experiences
- Participatory: Participants learn and grow through active, kinesthetic activities, that are multi-sensory and new experiences.
- **Safe Space**: Camp includes physical and emotional safety, where participants described camp as a place where they could be themselves without fear of judgment or ridicule.
- **Relational**: The camp experience is framed in an intensely relational environment that includes living together, meeting new people, practicing reconciliation, and encountering the other in face-to-face interaction.
- **Unplugged**: Camp exists in a set apart location that provides physical and emotional distance from environments that participants consider normal, which can provide perspective on the places participants left behind and to which they will return.

When a camp has these traits, the empirical impact on young people is significant. Campers experience an increase in self-confidence, willingness to try new things, and a more positive outlook on life. Spiritually, many youth have a deeper sense of the importance of a faith community, a stronger sense of God's presence in their daily life, and an increase in devotional practices and faith conversations.

Campers usually say they are going to camp to have fun, to be outdoors, and to be with friends. But there is so much more going on in the background and underneath. Participants, young and old, are growing in confidence and connection with themselves, with others, and with God in ways that can be hard to see in the moment but that have a shaping effect over time.

In an effort to be transparent with the donations made on behalf of the St. John's congregation, our July designations include:

- \$1,000 to Lutheran Disaster Relief Fund with the flooding in Texas on our minds.
- \$1,000 to Hope Center. It is on the front line for Rice County. Their mission is to create zero tolerance for sexual and domestic violence through Healing, Outreach, Prevention, and Education. 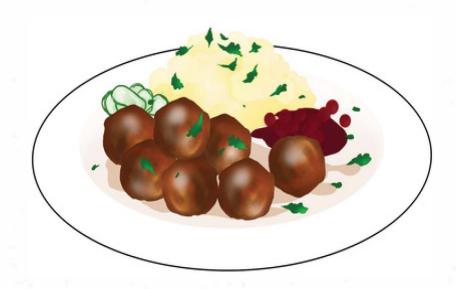

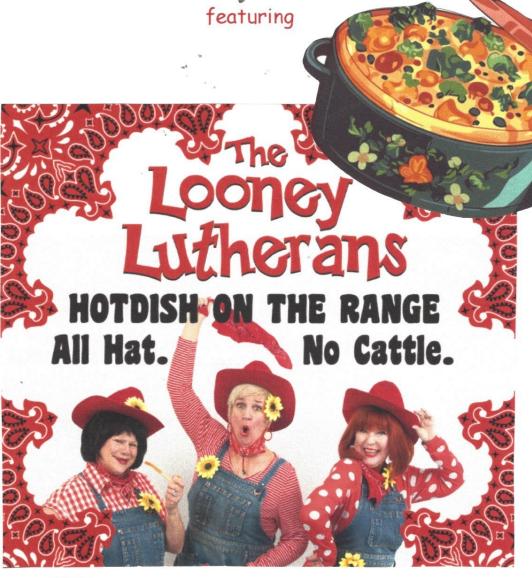

Greeters are Needed for Sunday Mornings

Greeting those who come into our building for worship on a Sunday morning with a friendly smile or some helpful assistance really does make a difference in creating the warm and welcoming environment we want to provide here at St. John's as people of faith. I have heard several stories from those who were new that being warmly greeted when they came here for worship was part of the reason they wanted to return to St. John's. We always want our visitors and members to have a feeling that they belong.

Please consider giving "greeting" on a Sunday morning a try! No prior experience is needed, and you can do greet by yourself, or with a friend or spouse, or with children. It's not difficult or time consuming simply arrive 15-20 minutes prior to service, put on a name tag, and stand either by the Commons area doors or the Southwest doors by the library. You can leave the door area when service begins, so you will not miss worship. We've had several wonderful repeat volunteers for greeting, and we'd be thrilled to see a few more new names on our hospitality sign-up list! More Ushers are Needed

What Exactly Do Ushers Do?

These important, yet easy tasks: lighting and distinguishing candles in the Sanctuary, ringing the big bell 5 minutes before worship begins, passing out bulletins as people arrive, assisting those who need help finding a seat, reserving pews for baptisms or other occasions, counting people in the Sanctuary for the attendance sheet, passing the collection plate during the offering, dismissing people from the pews for communion, tidying up the pews after worship, and collecting the Welcome sheets from the pew books for the office. Ushers also provide an extra set of eyes during worship, in case someone needs help or an incident occurs that needs attention.

ELCA Holds Churchwide Assembly

At the time this edition of *The Voice* is published, the ELCA Churchwide Assembly will be commencing in Phoenix Arizona, meeting from July 28 - August 2. The ELCA has a Churchwide Assembly every three years for the purpose of electing churchwide officers, considering matters of governance, and adopting churchwide memorials and social statements. Lay and rostered voting members are elected at synod assemblies the preceding year.

This year's assembly will include elections for Presiding Bishop. Bishop Elizabeth Eaton was first elected in 2013 and has served two six-year terms. She is not running again. The assembly will begin with an ecclesiastical ballot in which any ordained pastor of the ELCA may be nominated. In addition, 8 candidates have been pre-identified.

The church will also be electing a new Churchwide Secretary. This position, which may be held by a layperson or a rostered person, serves as the "recording officer" of the church, guiding governance and legal matters.

In addition, voting members will be considering recommended changes to the ELCA Constitution, recommendations from the Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church, and 34 different memorials. The memorials cover many salient concerns of our time, including the church's witness in a time of authoritarianism, concern for immigrants, justice for Palestine, child and vulnerable adult protection, and updates to the church's statements on end-of-life decisions and abortion.
