

Blessing Box at St. John's

"Take something if in need; leave something when blessed."



The congregation of St. John's continues to support the "Blessing Box", a mission that started in the fall of 2017. It is similar to the Little Libraries found around town except the Blessing box is filled with donated non-perishable food and personal hygiene products. The idea is that anyone who may be struggling can use the goods to make ends meet. The community is welcome to donate to the box being mindful of Minnesota's temperature changes. Donation Ideas (please check expiration dates): canned goods, pasta, flour, sugar, coffee, crackers, soap, mittens, toothbrush, baby items, such as diapers and pacifiers. The box is located in the drive-up on the north side of St. John's.

From Our Pastors

Martin Luther was born on November 10, 1483. He was baptized on November 11 and named Martin in honor of Martin of Tours, a saint honored in Germany to this day. As the days grow shorter in the northern hemisphere, St. Martin's Day celebrations involve community parades with handmade lanterns. The community gathers to light lamps and illuminate the night.

Martin of Tours was known for his generosity. The legend goes that as a Roman soldier he saw a poor old beggar at the city gate shivering in the cold. Having nothing else to give him, he took his own cloak, cut it in half with his sword, and gave half to the man to wrap himself in. The next time Martin dreamed of Christ wearing his half-cloak and saying "Martin, has covered me with his cloak."

Eventually Martin's faith led him to leave military service since he was no longer willing to kill. He became the patron saint of conscientious objectors and of France. As a bishop during the height of early theological controversies, he opposed capital punishment for those condemned of heresy.

Martin's legacy of peacemaking and generosity continue to inspire. How might we take a page from Martin's practice of dividing the cloak in our own lives? Consider some ways to honor this spirit of giving. This year, as ELCA World Hunger celebrates its 50th anniversary, perhaps we could take a page and offer 50% of something we have in abundance.

- Track what you spend on your family's Thanksgiving turkey
- Track what you spend on your veterinary bills
- If you have the luxury of traveling to see family, think about 50% of those costs.
- Going out for a holiday happy hour? Collect those receipts and consider a 50% donation.

On Sunday, November 24, we will be highlighting ELCA World Hunger. St. John's has typically been a leader in its generosity to this fund that serves both U.S. and international hunger projects. The Benevolence Board is challenging us to collect at least \$5,000 this year. Think about how you can give from your abundance in thanksgiving. When you do it for others, you do it for lesus himself.

St. John's Forum Series: Rediscovering Genesis Sundays at 9:45 a.m.

This fall, St. John's Forum will return to the old, familiar stories of Genesis that many of us learned in Sunday School - the stories of creation, Adam and Eve, and Noah and the flood. We'll dig into the stories of siblings who can't seem to get along, like Cain and Abel, Jacob and Esau, Rachael and Leah, and Joseph and his brothers. We'll also venture into some stories we rarely hear or read, like the stories of Hagar and Ishmael, and Judah's daughter Tamar. We expect to discover there's more to Genesis than we thought. We hope you'll see how Genesis insists on the invincibility of divine blessing in spite of the curse hanging over Eden and the reality of fractured human relationships, even among God's people. We hope you will join us in opening your Bibles and your minds to the rich meaning of these old, old stories that are too often overlooked. Advance preparation is not necessary, but we hope you'll read along as you are able. 



Pastor Pam Travels to Colombia

October 12-19, Pastor Fickenscher traveled with a group from around the ELCA to visit the Lutheran Church of Colombia (known as IELCO). The group was led by two churchwide staff for ELCA World Hunger, Kaitlynne Larson, our missionary who visited St. John's in August, and Jaime Dubon the ELCA head of the Latin American desk of Global Mission.

The delegation came from several synods of the ELCA, including one synod council member from Southeastern Minnesota. The whole group spent significant time in the capital city of Bogota, including Sunday morning worship and visits at the IELCO church offices. Then the group divided for two days into two smaller delegations in the Llanos region. Pam's group traveled to Bucaramanga and Giron in the state of Santander, to visit congregations and missions there.

The Lutheran church in Colombia is quite small: a mere 1800 members. But what they do with small numbers is amazing: ministry among the disabled, among seniors, among migrants from Venezuela are all accomplished with just a few resources. In addition, IELCO has a national reputation for its peacemaking work in the wake of the civil war. Our delegation learned about how ELCA funds for mission support, World Hunger, and Disaster Response all contribute to the impact that IELCO has through its congregations, missions, and special projects.

Pastor Pam will be sharing more of her experiences in an adult forum on Sunday, November 24.

With gratitude

Sustaining Grace Supports Mobile Home Energy Improvements

When St. John's began the Sustaining Grace campaign, we reached out to Northfield nonprofits about how our campaign might also assist their efforts toward sustainability and ecological justice. The Healthy Community Initiative responded with a proposal to help fund their work with mobile home weatherization.

Mobile home residents typically own their homes, but not the land it sits on. Rising assessments from the mobile home parks can make it difficult for residents to continue living there, and the age of many units means they are generally not well weatherized.

HCI is providing ongoing consulting and assistance to local mobile home residents so that they can make needed improvements. Often these efforts pay for themselves over time with lower energy bills. To date the project has helped 120 households and provided 35 professional assessments for plumbing, electrical and other needs.

St. John's second grant from Sustaining Grace was sent in September. HCl received \$20,000 towards its mobile home recovery fund.



Advance Care Planning: What ACP Is & Why It Matters to All Adults

Did you know that Advance Care Planning is a valuable process, not only for those in the later stages of life or those with a serious illness, but for adults of any health condition and any age? Are you aware that completing a health care directive is more about identifying your own personal values than about specifying specific medical treatments you do or do not want? How do you decide who is the best person to make decisions on your behalf, in the event you are ever unable to make them for yourself? In this forum, Advance Care Planning – a process of reflection, conversation and communication, and one that many adults recognize as important, but have not completed – will be described and demystified. Whether you would like information for yourself or for someone in your life, please join us to learn about how Advance Care Planning can provide peace of mind, knowing that your family and your care team are aware of your values and wishes, and will be able to honor your choices.

Two identical sessions, led by Susan Lohmann, will be offered, Sunday, December 8th at 9:45 and Wednesday, January 8th at 6:15, both in St. John's Hall.

Susan Lohmann is a recently retired clinical social worker, and a member of St. John's, who practiced in the areas of hospice, hospital, long term care, oncology and private practice counseling. She has been active in providing community education and guidance about health care directives, and is a certified Advance Care Planning facilitator.

The planning process for the Community Christmas Day Dinner event hosted by St. John's has begun!


To help make this wonderful dinner that is free and open to all successful, many volunteers and food donations will be needed.



Advent Book Read: All Creation Waits

The Adult Ministry & Education Board invites you to join us in reading All Creation Waits: The Advent Mystery of New Beginnings during the Advent Season.

We've chosen this book because it encourages us to learn from the animal world as we begin our own season of waiting. In each daily reflection on the wintering habits of animals in the upper Midwest, the author Gayle Boss deftly draws out metaphors for the creative work of God in this season of waiting. Each daily meditation focuses on a sin-



gle animal as it adapts to the deepening cold of winter. In each case, Boss shows how the animal world has its own unique beauty and wonder. She also uses these meditations as windows into the practice of waiting, of seeking out community, drawing on hidden resources, and awakening to new life.
