2. Board Minutes/Notes from March 14, 2017

Adult Education & Ministry Board St. John's Lutheran Church 14 March 2017

Present: Pr. Jonathan Davis, Alyssa Ness, Genevieve Quarberg, Jonathan Reid, Martin Thorsheim; Christy Hall-Holt visiting.

Planning for upcoming events

After lengthy discussion, we decided that we like the idea of sponsoring/organizing at least two "Summer Suppers" sometime between June and August, when Wednesday Meals will not be held at church as during the rest of the year.

- People have expressed to Pr. Davis an interest in progressive dinner-type events connected to the church, possibly with a component of Lectio Divina (a meditative reading of Scripture), which is practiced at Accompany. While we've done Progressive Dinners in the past, we thought it might be best to start out with a couple of "stationary" ones, just to gauge interest, and because with Progressive Dinners, the moving around can become a focal point, rather than taking the time to engage with others.
- Small groups (up to 12ish people) are really nice and intimate; allow time to interact and get to know others in the group. Dates would have to be scheduled ahead of time, to allow for summer planning.
- Pr. Davis has a contact who has volunteered to help organize this sort of event; he will be in touch with her to see how she wants to contribute to the effort. Depending on her level of involvement, this board may be responsible for a number of the planning points, including signups, advertising (article in the Voice, posters), speaking with potential hosts, etc. We think it might work well to post sign-up sheets for hosts and guests, and see what sort of response we get and organize the groups from there (we think it best to randomly assign guests to hosts, as then people will not be tempted to run in their familiar, comfortable circles and will hopefully meet new people). When groups are assigned, the hosts could be informed of their group and send out a "welcome" e-mail detailing directions to their home and suggestions for dishes the guests could bring, if applicable.
- Possibly we could open this up for people to invite friends or other guests outside of the St. John's community.

We are also considering the idea of Wednesday evening "picnics"/"socials"/etc. on a couple of Wednesdays when the Summer Suppers aren't being held.

- Possibly a way to engage the surrounding neighborhoods and enjoy time together outdoors. It's noted that other local churches offer "free hamburger" events to reach out to the nearby community. We don't necessarily want to copy these events, but it seems worthwhile to consider more engagement with our neighbors, if any might be interested in coming out to meet us, if opportunities presented themselves.
- If we also did event(s) like this in the summer, we'd likely aim for scheduling them in June and/or July, as August is the month for Night to Unite.

The idea of a service day in the fall was floated to us as a way to kick off the year together, but we did not discuss this idea in depth at this meeting.

Organization

We briefly touched on some of the notes that Genevieve gathered in her fact-finding, among which she highlighted that there are a number of important programs/ministries here that are established but have no prescribed system or process of passing on their leadership roles, which will pose a risk to them in the future. There are groups (such as the current book clubs lead by David Sudermann and Kristin Partlo) that more or less spring up on their own with the blessing of a pastor(s), and which have no set starting or ending point.

It was also noted that the Director of Shared Ministry is tasked with a lot of items for which there is little outside support (from boards, other groups, etc.), now that the boards are structured as they are and the Parish Fellowship board no longer exists in that form. The current Shared Ministry position is only 20 hours PT at church, so the person in this role has to be careful how s/he allots this time, in order to avoid burnout. A lot of things fall onto this role (kitchen things, etc.) when others do not pick them up.

Forum

We briefly touched on the topic of Forum planning for the future. General thoughts were that it might be nice to have a few representatives from certain boards, as well as some sort of representatives in the areas of music and theology (perhaps some people connected to the colleges).

The question was raised whether there is a reason to have a Forum, as it seems that not many attend it. We wonder if it wouldn't be better to replace it with multiple small-group offerings instead—things which would have beginning and ending points (certain kinds of series or the like).

It's noted that, in terms of what we can offer that is being sought, people have a hunger for something where they can express or find transcendence, regardless of specific religion. Some people find that type of connection though personal friends or relationships, where they can talk about anything and feel comfortable being themselves; community. We wonder if there is a way to reach out beyond the walls of Christianity and/or Lutheranism, perhaps through monthly community events hosted at St. John's (ex: crossover music performances, from artists like Maria Schneider of Windom, MN, now in a jazz band in New York). What if on "First Fridays" [of the month], St. John's hosted a group/speaker/artist at church as a community event, or took a more active role in celebrating more "special days" (like Earth Day, etc.) with the community?

Minutes of Adult Ministry & Education Board St. John's Lutheran Church 24 January 2017

Overview of 2016

Genevieve Quarberg is a new member of our board, and we spent some time at the start of our meeting welcoming her and familiarizing her with the topics and issues we've been working with over the past year or two, including:

- Difficulty in knowing what to offer / what is sought:
 - Some activities/groups are currently offered (ex: BOLD Café, youth music group), but are suffering from a lack of interest/attendance, leading to questions of whether different approaches need to be attempted, or whether these are not the types of things that people are seeking or wanting to make time for in their schedules.

- Genevieve said this prompts questions: what are we to do or be, and what's essential to being a Christian church? We felt these could be good questions to branch out from in our discovery process.
- Current status of the Adult Forum
 - The large planning committee that formerly set up the events for the year has been dissolved; at this point the planning is being done by the pastors. It is not sustainable to expect the pastors to continue in this way, so we need to come up with some alternative options and ideas.
 - We also need to discuss the format of the Forum: is it best to keep it as-is, or could changes be made to make it more accessible? Should it be split into two events on Sundays, so that congregants have more options for how they want to spend the time between services?
- Library oversight
 - o We have reestablished a more firm connection with the library over the past year, and given the committee their requested budget, which had in recent years been absorbed into other, more generic budgets. We want to reserve some room in the budget for the church to purchase books that are relevant to the various activities that might be going on at church (ex: purchase a copy or two of the Lenten book read's book; purchase a copy of books that relate to certain Forum or other topics that arise over the year), so we have asked the committee to run titles past us for approval; maintenance costs, such as for book covers, tape, etc. do not have to be approved by us.

Goals for 2017

We ended the meeting by discussing some of our goals, thoughts, and applied experience for the upcoming year:

- It could be very helpful to plot out the calendar for future events and then zero in our focus on those upcoming events. This would not only set up the calendar ahead of time to allow for more advertising of events, but also help us to know what we need to focus on, in terms of preparation, etc.
- Increase communication with board members throughout the month (not just limited to board meetings, as it's been in the recent past)
- We should look to the mission statement and perhaps see if there are themes for the year that we can focus on.
- Look towards increasing intersectionality at church.
- Possibly change the name of this board to "Adult Ministry and Learning Board," to reflect more
 of an "action" instead of a passive
- Perhaps change our board's meeting time (some members are uncomfortable with night meetings/driving)? We might be able to have longer meetings on Saturdays or some other time.

1. Solveig and Kathy gave us an update on the refugee family (see attached report). St. John's is asked to donate \$4000 to assist the family while Paul searches for a new job. Bernie reports that there is currently \$3938 in the refugee fund. We will use this amount.

The family plans to move to St. Cloud where Ariat's sister lives, but this probably won't happen until after Paul finds a job there. We hope to continue contact with them after they move.

After they move, we will look into sponsoring another family.

2. We received our first grant application. It was from Northfield Athletic Boosters. We sent Don Sahling an email asking if he would contact Jim Blaha about whether the CAC will request a grant.

The NRC sent an inquiry about doing an electronic application. Dave checked into this, and advise that we accept paper applications only.

It was suggested that we send email reminders to the nonprofits we don't hear from.

- 3. We discussed replacements for the vacancy on our board. Jane will ask Sue Sharrow.
- *I talked to Sue on 3/16 and she agreed to join the board.
- 4. Mission Fund: Pastor Pam, Terry Gilbertson and Kristin Partlo are on the mission trip to Tanzania. Enough donations came in to cover the costs. We met our goal of raising \$2000 to help the Stubbs family with extra expenses related to Carol's cancer treatment. Bernie has sent the check to the fund for them at the DeKalb Lutheran Church.
- 5. Our board does devotions (Kathy volunteered) and snacks at boards on April 4th.
- 6. We do the soup supper clean up on Wed. Ap. 12. Be at church at 5:30.
- 7. We agreed to start the dispersement of discretionary funds next month.

We discussed the end of the year Sunday School Celebration, which will be held on Sunday, May 14, 2017. It will be held in-between services. After a discussion, it was decided that the Celebration will be held downstairs, as it was last year. The theme will be a combination of the Good Samaritan, and the countries that the Sunday School has learned about this year. Julie invited those from the Committee who want to help discuss curriculum to join a group she will be putting together to discuss the curriculum for next year. There was discussion whether we should use Spark for another year, or look at other curriculum. There was no consensus of opinion regarding this topic.

Julie is hoping to do Sunday School registration starting in April.

Prayer Buddies is in progress, and the feedback so far has been very positive.

The Committee will be doing cleanup at the Soup Supper tomorrow, March 15, 2017.

The Easter Egg Hunt will be Saturday, April 15th. Julie will need help filling and hiding eggs. 10 children have already signed up for going to camp at Green Lake Lutheran Ministries. The dates are from June 18-23, 2017.

Hero Central is the theme for the joint VBS program. This year all ages will be at Bethel Lutheran Church. The dates of VBS are June 12-15, 2017.

To date, \$7300 was raised at the Youth fundraiser. No one signed up for the Committee's donation (Parent's night out). The Committee decided to cancel the event, rather than try to get sign-ups.

Baby care kits will be assembled in an intergenerational event on Sunday, March 26th.

The committee had a long discussion about Pastor Jon's challenge for us to develop a program focused on trying to connect parents of Sunday School children in between services on Sundays. Many ideas were discussed. A survey of parents might be done this spring to assist with further planning. Several issues were determined. There will need to be a host/hostess. It will not be every Sunday. The board discussed having good coffee (Caribou?) available, a planned presentation/discussion 1 Sunday a month, casual discussion available perhaps 2 other Sundays, and one Sunday where coffee will be available but parents could also feel free to run errands, etc. The Committee discussed possibly asking using some of the Youth and Children fund from the Foundation to help with the cost of this program, as no budgeting for this program had been included in this year'[s budget. Having once a month family activity was also discussed, so that parents, when they see each other on Sunday. will have something they can start their conversations with.

Julie talked about a seminar she went to on Thursday, March 9, 2017, entitled Churches Growing Young. It discussed how to engage 15-29 year olds in the church.

- 2. YB Members Areas of Interest/Initiatives
 - a. Backdrop of distinctiveness platform and adaptive challenge outlines above
 - b. All members discussed their general interest and reason for joining YB
 - c. Some specific interests/initiatives shared:
 - Dan building character in youth & inter-generational opportunities. As former guidance counselor, Dan suggested offering guidance for post-secondary planning with high schoolers.
 - ii. Mike promoting mentorships and relationship between youth and adults in St. John's congregation
 - iii. Terri providing opportunities for service for youth. Suggested meals on wheels on Sundays after church as a good fit for youth who have DLs. Also suggested finding ways to engage youth in forum topics (e.g. race).
 - iv. Beret mentorships between older kids and younger kids. Oden noted it's best if significant gap between ages of mentor/mentee.
 - v. Jenny improving communication about youth events to ensure parents and youth aware and commit ahead of time to get critical mass. Also, outreach to non-member youth to make them feel welcome at St. Johns or at least feel welcome to participate in individual faith experiences.
