

God's Call for Us

The people of St. John's Lutheran Church in Northfield, MN, children of God one and all, are called to live out the Gospel through welcoming, worshiping, and witnessing to our neighbors throughout God's creation.

In 2023, the congregation voted to introduce a capital campaign to raise significant financial resources to support a variety of initiatives that focus on sustainability. In January 2024, the St. John's Congregational Council voted to set a goal of \$750,000 over a three-year period to help ensure that we are doing everything we can to make our faith community as welcoming and sustainable as we are able. This decision was affirmed at the annual meeting of the congregation.

When we designed and built St. John's Hall, we envisioned thousands of our neighbors using our space each year. When previous generations invested in our sanctuary, they envisioned a place where all who entered could feel God's presence.

As a result of our faith and these successful campaigns, thousands of residents come through our space each year to worship, receive a hot meal, participate in community meetings and musical events, and so much more. For us to continue to fulfill our mission, it is imperative for us find new ways to protect our planet, while making our space more welcoming and affordable for more people to utilize it.

We are called to serve our neighbors in so many ways. That is why this capital campaign will not only create a lasting legacy through enhancing our sustainability, but also through benevolence initiatives that will touch the lives of our neighbors throughout the community.

ensure that all of us can work together to address the plethora of needs ... physical, financial, emotional, and spiritual.

Now is the time to plan for a greener building that reduces our energy costs and our carbon footprint. In

preparation for this sustainability campaign, a number of foundational tasks have been completed, including an engineering assessment of our building, extensive research into energy-saving opportunities, and examinations of new government programs designed to assist smaller organizations like St. John's in becoming more energy efficient and better global citizens.

Additionally, a tithe has been included for benevolence beyond our building. Each of the campaign initiatives enable us to lead by example while taking tangible steps to improve our contributions to the world around us.

Sustaining our environment and budgets

We are investing in our facilities in a manner that not only improves the world around us, but also makes us more energy-efficient and costconscious in fulfilling and expanding our mission. Congregationalapproved initiatives include:

- Installation of a solar array
- Replacement of heat exchangers for St. John's Hall
- New energy-efficient, induction kitchen range
- New energy-efficient kitchen dishwasher
- Air handling improvements
- On-demand water heaters

Sustaining our safety

While not glamorous, there are critical needs on the church grounds that require attention to ensure a welcoming environment that safeguards our congregants and guests. The major items that need attention include:

- External stair repair
- Improved security systems
- Parking lot replacement and curb repair
- Tuckpointing
- New flooring in Sunday school rooms

St. John's has a long history of congregational benevolence to spread the Gospel through word and deed not only within our walls but throughout our community and throughout our world.

This campaign is committed to furthering our impact in strong and meaningful ways that are aligned with our sustainability initiatives:


- Extending our benevolence throughout Northfield

Making an Impact


Cumulative Dollars Saved (20-year Projection)

Assumes a 3% rate of inflation in electrical rates and the most-conservative estimates for energy generation. The project will result in immediate operational cost savings.



Carbon Savings in Pounds (20-year Projection)

The collective improvements realized by utilizing more efficient water heaters and air exchangers, in addition to the offsets produced by the solar array.
