From our pastors . . .

Bearing Iruit

In January of 1998, St. John's congregation voted to start a new endeavor, to become Mission Founders to a new congregation in the ELCA, site to be determined. The congregation committed to raising \$150,000 beyond our normal budget to fund this new start over five years. In addition, the congregation voted to raise \$50,000 over the same amount of time to support Mwangaza, a ministry in Tanzania founded and led by St. John's member Shoonie Hartwig, and to commit \$6,000 more to the Southeastern Minnesota Synod's Walking Three by Three campaign, working with our partners in Colombia and Tanzania. These goals were all met over the course of the next few years, thanks to many faithful members of the congregation.

This may seem like old news, and it is, but we recently heard of fruits borne from those seeds which began to be planted over a decade ago. The week after Easter we received a call from one of the lay leaders at Rejoice Lutheran Church in Frisco, Texas, the congregation for which we became a Mission Founder congregation. Rejoice wanted St. John's to know that on Maundy Thursday of this year they worshipped in their new building, and that they continue to give thanks for our support in their early years. The money we gave and sent to them in those five years was an important part of their continuing to survive, and eventually thrive. The new building is phase 1 of a long-range strategic plan for the congregation. We don't always see the fruits of seeds we plant in our lives. Individually and as a congregation, we touch the world, touch people's lives, make a difference. But much of that difference is unseen, unknown, for some time. Seeing the picture of Rejoice's building is a joyful thing, because we can see the concrete results of a vision this congregation had, a vision which led to action and to making a difference.

We continue to seek God's vision for us and for this place. We are operating under the theme "Extending God's Love," based on our vision plan of the past couple years. That growing and thriving congregation in Texas is the result of St. John's extending God's love. Now they also are able to extend God's love through their ministry. And it keeps on growing, spreading, in the wisdom and grace of God.

As we enter the season where the earth brings forth great fruits, and we see the goodness of God's agriculture, God's nurture of this world, visible in green leaves and good things to eat, let's also ask God's help in seeing how God's love is also growing and spreading through us. Let's open our eyes to new visions of growth, new visions of grace, new visions of extending God's love through our work here together. Amazing things will happen, as we see now in Texas! God help us all to see, and act, and so bear fruit.

Of those girls who did not make it to A-Level, sixty four graduates are teaching in Primary School throughout Maasailand. Special Congregational Meeting-Approval of 2009 Revised General Fund Budget

On Sunday, Apr. 26, 2009 at a Special Congregational Meeting, the St. John's Lutheran Church congregation approved the revised general fund budget as approved and presented by the Church Council. The Church Council approved various budget reductions totaling approximately \$38,000.00 which is highlighted below. As part of the 2009 budget process and solution, all staff salaries and benefits were held at 2008 levels. Additionally, approximately \$73,000.00 was approved to be transferred from the 2006 hail storm insurance proceeds to fund the remaining 2009 general fund expense budget shortfall. Following is a brief recap of the 2009 budget as originally presented at the annual meeting in January and subsequently revised.







From the Peace and Justice group . . .

Keep Active for Justice and Peace in the summer

Although the Peace and Justice Group does not meet in June and July, the work for justice and peace does not end. Many of the activities of the year will continue as we respond to requests for advocacy for people in danger and for those in need of shelter, food, support, and for correction of injustice that threatens lives and livelihood. Keeping vulnerable people and places in our prayers is a priority, as always.

Summer, with its changed schedules and routines, can be a great time to explore your values and commitments in new ways. Which of these ideas might work for you and your family?

Focus on learning about one part of the world, or a specific issue. Look for opportunities to discuss what you learn with a friend or two.

Make your learning personal. Look carefully at the faces of those who are affected by war, violence, fear, or pain. Imagine being there.

Connect with real people. Volunteer to help at Thursday's Table and sign up to deliver Meals on Wheels. Reach out to someone you care about but have not been in touch with during the year.

Write or call your legislators to let them know what you think about a current issue.

Talk together about times when a conflict is resolved in a nonviolent way.

Read the biography of a peacemaker: Dorothy Day, Martin Luther King Jr., Denise Levertov, Oscar Arias Sanchez, Rosa Parks, Jane Addams, Aung San Suu Kyi, or Pete Seeger.

Nurture your spirit with a time each day to reflect on what is important to you. Celebrate with a child the goodness in your lives.

Don Kimber Honored as Food Shelf Volunteer

St. John's member Don Kimber was recognized for his volunteer work at the Northfield Community Action Center (CAC) Food Shelf last month at the Minnesota FoodShare Campaign celebration lunch hosted by the Greater Minneapolis Council of Churches.

CAC Program Director Judy Bickel nominated Don for the award. She wrote, "Don is a World War II Merchant Marine veteran who has served his country and his home town all of his life in many different ways...Everyone that has had the opportunity to work alongside Don quickly realizes that he has a heart of gold and true compassion for every individual that comes to the CAC Food Shelf. In addition to helping distribute food and stock shelves very Tuesday, Don also picks up food donations from Target two or three times a week and often helps serve food at the CAC's Thursday's Table dining program...Don is a real life hero."

Minnesota FoodShare announced that the 2009 March Campaign raised 12,020,197 pounds of food and dollars combined, statewide. The Northfield CAC was recognized at the awards ceremony for conducting the 14th most successful food drive in the state, raising over 130,000 dollars and pounds...More than four hundred households are receiving food at the CAC Food Shelf each month.

Thank you to St. John's members, including Sunday School students, who contributed to Minnesota FoodShare and congratulations, Don! St. John's has supported Marv and Jean through the ELCA Division of Global Mission since 2005. The complete newsletter is posted on the Mission Board in the Commons.

Dear Friends,

The National Exam Council announced that the Form IV exam results...were released on May 1. The grades for the Maasae Girls Lutheran Secondary School were not great, no Division Ones, but nothing below Division Three: it was 3 Division II and 9 Division III. All 12 girls are now eligible to go on to further education, possibly 6 to university (bachelor degree) and 6 to the two year teachers' training programs (diploma) to become "O" level teachers. But this is the news: all passed. Their future is open before them, if only there was scholarship funding... I wish you could be here and see the anxiety in their eyes as they come to discuss what their future might hold. When the school first began in 1995 the completion of Form Four was the goal for students. Then the goal changed to help students complete Form Six. Now we need to help students get through to the next level of education – to help them find a vocation. At first the Maasai community questioned the value of educating girls, now the Maasai are looking to see if education has any potential to economically contribute to the well-being of the family. To be considered successful, our graduates must reach a position of influence and economic independence: there needs to be a collective mass of these young educated women in order for the culture to sit up and take notice. With the gracious help of God, the culture IS changing. Cultures change slowly...From the beginning of our assignment our vision
