Update from the Call Committee

By the time you read this, the St. John's Call Committee will have finished its work on the first phase of the Call Process, that being the completion of the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). The MSP is a comprehensive document which describes our congregation and our plans for the future, and details the qualities and expectations we would have in a Senior Pastor. The prior work of the Strategic Planning Committee has been of great help in getting the MSP completed in a timely and relevant fashion.

This profile, once approved by the Council, is then provided to the Synod office, who in turn, provides it to all potential candidates who have expressed an interest in the Senior Pastor position at St. John's. Once submitted to the Synod, we will expect to begin receiving candidate names that the Synod has identified through their internal processes. Additionally, we have received from our members, the names of nine (9) potential candidates for Senior Pastor. These candidate names have been forwarded to the Synod and will be included in those names that the Synod has developed. It appears that we will have a sizeable group of potential Senior Pastor candidates as we begin the next phase of our work.

The LaSalle Street Church has a long history of reaching out to the neighborhoods around LaSalle and Wells streets on the southwest edge of downtown Chicago. From 1856 to around 1900 the congregation, with leadership from Lutheran missionaries, served the German, Swedish, and Irish immigrants living in the area. In 1910 what had begun as an Italian Bible study at the nearby Moody Church grew into the Moody Italian Mission and in 1936 the Italian Mission purchased the LaSalle Street church building for its growing ministry. In 1942 construction began on the nearby Cabrini-Green housing development for low-income families. In addition to serving the Italian community, the LaSalle congregation provided worship space for the growing Japanese, African American, and Appalachian white communities. In 1961 members of the Italian Mission felt called to move the worshipping community beyond its "mission" status to become a congregation where all members of the neighborhood would be welcome to join together in Christian worship, education, and service. In 1973 the LaSalle Street Church was established and continues to serve the neighborhood in Christ's name.

Last month members of St. John's mission trip helped to serve a meal at the LaSalle Street Church's Breaking Bread meal. Every Wednesday the congregation serves a home-cooked meal to around one hundred homeless and hungry guests. The meal is served restaurant-style with real plates and silverware. A nurse is available to answer basic questions about health concerns. Free clothing is offered after most meals and there is always some kind of opportunity for Bible study or worship. The evening the St. John's group served there was a memorial service for Mother Rose Jefferson. Mother Rose was a regular guest at

Breaking Bread who had died a few weeks earlier. The memorial service included readings from John 14 and Psalm 23, remembrances from members of the Breaking Bread community, and the singing of *Blessed Assurance*.

Throughout its history the LaSalle Street Church has gone into the neighborhoods that surround the church building, trying to show those who live nearby that the congregation cares about them – by responding to their needs and by providing opportunities for worship, learning, and fellowship. This is the work that every Christian congregation is called to do.

Last month St. John's members volunteered at the CAC Food Shelf. This month we have an opportunity to meet our neighbors at a picnic meal here at church on Tuesday, August 2, starting at 5:30 p.m. On Saturday, August 6 members of St. John's will help lay the foundation at the Thrivent Builds/Habitat for Humanity house in Northfield. This fall the Northfield elementary schools are inviting church members to help tutor students in a program called Accelerate Northfield. Where else is God's mission leading us at St. John's?

As we seek to respond to God's gifts and God's call during this time of transition I want you to know that I met with members of the call committee this summer and informed them that I would not be submitting my name to be considered as a candidate for senior pastor. Please know that I continue in my role as your pastor. It is a blessing to share this mission of serving in Christ's name with you at St. John's.

God's Unsolicited Love

So we were walking down the street:Lynette and I, our children, and the two grandchildren. Suddenly, four-year-old Owen stopped, looked up at his grandmother, and said, "I love you Grandma." It came out of the blue, and it stopped all of us in our tracks. Owen's father, our son-in-law, commented, "Wow. Totally unsolicited. It doesn't get any better. " No, it doesn't!

Isn't that what we as Lutherans bring into the Christian faith, a reminder of God's unsolicited love? "While we still were sinners," the Apostle Paul writes, "Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). We know that we aren't deserving. We know there is nothing we can do. We know that no solicitation can earn the love offered to us out of our God's grace and mercy. "Totally unsolicited. It doesn't get any better."

There seems to be a lot of conversation regarding God's love these days. Certain authors have focused their writings in these areas. Many of the conversations I have experienced in church meetings also seem to center on

God's love. But what I often hear is a reaction to what some feel is the "cheapening" of this wonderful gift, that if it comes too easily, folks won't value it. As one man commented, "all I ever hear is love, love, love. I'm sick of it."

Certainly there is nothing cheap about the love God offers us. Luther reminds us of the price, "Not with silver or gold, but with his holy and precious blood and his innocent suffering and death." And we can receive such love only with wonder and gratitude. But I fear that too often even well-meaning attempts to somehow protect this gift and limit the guest list do, in fact, cheapen it. The extravagance of God's love is that there are not conditions. The priceless tag on this gift announces that it is offered to all - even the undeserving - you know, like you and me.

God's totally unsolicited love. It doesn't get any better. No, it doesn't!

Northfield's low-income students have trailed their peers in average reading and math proficiency by more than 25% over the last 5 years. And this group is growing: almost 1/3 of Northfield's elementary students now receive free or reduced-price lunches—a 50% increase since 2004.



New Supply List for School Kits

Donations needed for the school kits! Below are the essentials, please feel free to donate the following items:

- ♦ Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper about 8" X 10". No loose-leaf paper,
- ♦ One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- ♦ One pencil sharpener
- ♦ One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)

From the Peace and Justice group . . .

Love and Justice

In Mark 12:30-31, Jesus quotes the Old Testament summary of what God expects of us: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with your mind." and "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Who and what do you love? How do you treat them? How do you observe others treating them? What can you do to support the love God calls every one of us to extend to our neighbors far and near? How can we *love* people we haven't even met?

These are challenging questions, the kind faced by God's people every day. Author, theologian, artist, and academic Cornel West offers this helpful insight: "Justice is what love looks like in public." How and where does your love show up in public? Consider the projects and pains that pull at your heart and call you to action. In these challenging times, choosing and committing to a cause can be a challenge of its own. Whatever you care about, here are some suggestions to guide you as you put the love you have received unconditionally from God to work for justice.

- 1) Be informed. Learn the history of your project and keep current on events that relate to it. Seek out reliable sources of information.
- 2) Get involved. Observe first hand what the real issues and needs are for the people and/or projects that grab your attention.

- 3) Donate time, money, and skills as you are able. Support people working for justice on the ground, individually or through agencies that are both transparent and trustworthy.
- 4) Join an existing organization that works lovingly for justice, or start your own. Look first for one at church.
- 5) Talk or write about your efforts positively and clearly. Connect what you are doing with what you believe. Engage in honest conversations with old friends and new audiences that lead to acting for love and justice.
- 6) Host events designed to educate and stir responses. Show a documentary, display an art exhibit, or sponsor a public performance, and then facilitate a discussion about it. Staff an information table at places where people congregate.
- 7) Promote services and products that support the success of those who in need of love and seeking justice.
- 8) Pray for love and justice for all.
- 9) Hear about the work of the Northfield Human Rights Commission at the September 19th meeting of the Peace and Justice Group. Dick Kleber, a member of the Commission, will join us. Bring your questions, your concerns, your energy and your love.




