From our pastors . . .

As St. John's prepares to receive its new senior pastor, now would be a good time to review the past fourteen months of transition and ministry. The strategic planning effort, which was well underway when I arrived, deserves tremendous credit for moving St. John's forward, and helping to place the congregation in a significantly better place. The debt reduction team has us very close to "unbound," as we should notice over \$50,000 in former debt cost available for mission and ministry in 2012. The work of the strategic planning team was essential in identifying core values, which should help shape direction for the future. Their labors also formed a solid foundation from which the call committee could operate. Thank you to all involved in the movement.

The leaders at St. John's committed to presenting a balanced budget to the congregation for 2011. This led to making some extremely difficult decisions and tough choices. The significant cuts in expenditures meant the loss of 1-3/4 staff positions, and lower budget lines across the board.

However, in the midst of all of this, we have had Boards step up and become more forward thinking than ever, along with becoming "hands-on" leadership groups. Your staff has been great over this time. With the cuts, there was a need for everyone to pick up some slack, and that has really happened. This group is a real team. They serve St. John's extremely well.

Throughout the year we have experienced the opportunity to try and discover new and different ministry efforts. The neighborhood meal in August is but one example of a new type of outreach. Turning "Welcome Sunday" into "Welcome week" was a huge success, and it highlighted the importance of our Wednesday night meals programming – for fellowship and education. The recently completed Pie Social led to a doubled worship attendance at the Thanksgiving Eve service (feed them and they will come?). And, of course, we tried a few new things in worship (expansion of the number of assisting ministers, means of distribution of communion, schedules for all assistants and workers, to name a few).

However, the thing that has impressed me most about this time of preparation is the commitment and ability to continue in supportive strong roles with our mission partners in Tanzania, Columbia, Minneapolis; and our ministry partners (Lutheran Social Services, Lutheran World Relief, ELCA World Hunger Appeal, SE MN Synod and churchwide benevolence, Habitat for Humanity, and many more).

Now, the very important work of the "Next Step," the task of visioning and working toward what children's youth and family ministry should look like for the future of the congregation. This is a significant action towards shoring up a core value of St. John's.

All of this is to say that you are to be commended for your efforts during this time of transition and preparation. And yet, your time of preparation continues, as you make ready to receive your new senior pastor. Dream of the ways to welcome him into your midst; and into the process of defining the mission and ministry identity of St. John's Lutheran Church.


AV Ministry Team Looking for Volunteers

A Note from the St. John's Kitchen Committee

Since we do not have a custodian on staff at church, we need help with the garbage and recycle.

1) After any event please empty all the garbage into the large garbage can by the dishwasher. 2) Recycling: Wash all containers and take all cans, plastic containers, glass and paper for recycling to the recycling container provided by Waste Management. It is outside the exit door closest dishwasher. Aluminum foil or foil pans cannot be recycled. Please do not leave the recycling in the entrance/exit area as it is would not be approved by the Fire Marshall. Thank you!

From the Peace and Justice group . . . Build Bridges!

"Building Bridges Not Walls"

NHS students report on the October International Conference in Drammen, Norway

Monday, Jan. 9 7 p.m. St. John's Hall

All are welcome!

When twelve Northfield High School students left for the peace conference "Build Bridges Not Walls" in Drammen, Norway, the third week of October, they were excited:

"I'm super pumped...We have such a geat group," said senior Sophie Scheuerman, anticipating how they would share what they learned when they returned.

"I'm interested in carrying my experience in Norway back here...hopefully making a difference in our school," said sophomore Helen Forsythe.

And they returned with increased enthusiasm. On Monday, January 9, the group will share with us many parts of the conference and how we can be part of the way it influences our community.

"I think that when bringing back things we learned and implementing them into our community, we could begin simply by educating students about other cultures and current events around the world," suggests sophomore Scout Gregerson.

Sophomore Ian Iverson adds, "We bring back a number of challenges for both ourselves and our community. One of our most important goals is encouraging a deeper connection between the Latino population and the greater Northfield community. This experience showed me that we are all human, all flesh and bone, whatever our cultural background or geographical location."

Conference days were structured around workshops which students chose for the week according to their interests: International School of Global Understanding, Visual Arts 1, Visual Arts 2, Photography, Film Evenings were for large group actiities: Discussions of the importance of respect for human dignity, a hike up a mountain, informal evenings for socializing, a banquet for presentations by the groups.

"Build bridges - not walls" is a joint project by the municipality of Drammen, the United Nations Association of Norway and the Norwegian Helsinki Committee. Since 1998 the project has organised festivals, conferences, workshops and human rights schools in Drammen, Red Wing, MN, and in Mostar, Bosnia and Herzegovina. Paul and Loey Christenson who lead the program in Red Wing invited Northfield students to participate with them this year. The enthusiastic response of Northfielders led to their having their own strong delegation under the leadership of NHS teacher Sarah Swan McDonald.

The week long seminar helps to fulfill the objectives of the Norwegian Helsinki Committee to increase the understandting of human rights, cooperation between multi-cultural groups, knowledge of nonviolent resolution of conflict. Update from El Milagro:


Members of St. John's met with Pr. Judith VanOsdol and El Milagro council president Jane Norman last month. In 2011 El Milagro was designated a "mission redevelopment" congregation in the ELCA. As part of the redevelopment El Milagro has made the difficult decision to sell its current building and has plans to worship at Calvary Lutheran in south Minneapolis beginning this month. The move will allow both El Milagro and Calvary to share ministry and resources while allowing El Milagro to maintain its identity as a congregation serving the people of south Minneapolis – including the Latino community. Pr. Judith ask that St. John's keep the people of El Milagro and Calvary in prayer as they enter this new time of shared ministry.

Chicago Mission Trip, 2011

Thirteen members of St. John's travelled to Chicago in July to participate in a week-long mission trip organized through Center for Student Missions. Youth and chaperones assisted teachers in a summer school program run by an organization called Casa Central; served at a homeless shelter called A Safe Haven and helped to serve a free meal called "Breaking Bread" at the LaSalle Street Church. Other activities included walking tours of city neighborhoods and meals at neighborhood restaurants.
