#### "I Talk Too Much"

Stephen Ministers who are no longer active in our church's program tell us that they still find themselves serving as unofficial Stephen Ministers. People who need that kind of care show up in their lives regularly. Here is one recent story:

In early December I received a note from someone I hadn't heard from in decades, Ian. She was a corridor mate who transferred to another college after her freshman year and now lives half a continent away. She'd found an old photo of the two of us and wondered what had become of me. Her note told me a few facts about her life: she had been a widow for fifteen years, had children and grandchildren living nearby, and was struggling with "a serious illness." I phoned her to ask about the illness, and the conversation lasted more than an hour. During that time she said to me several times, "My friends all tell me I talk too much." "My kids say I talk too

much." Then she would find more to tell me. She asked almost no questions about my life, but I learned a lot about hers. For one thing, her illness was incurable—she didn't expect to be around next Christmas. For another, she considered that she had "made a mess of her life"; she had chosen the wrong profession, had married the wrong man.

Afterwards I fretted about this conversation. I couldn't set Jan's problems aside, and I couldn't fix any of them. Then the Stephen Minister in me surfaced. There was something I could do for Jan: I could offer her a listening ear. I could pay close attention to what

## From our pastors . . .

Sunday, February 5 marks my last day among the good folks of St. John's Lutheran Church. It has been a joy to serve with you over the past 15 months. During that time the word, "transition," perhaps became all too familiar. However, transition is the "name of the game" these days in outreach and ministry. My not so bold prediction is that you are in for much more transition in the near future.


Change, for the sake of change, is not as good. However, I have learned, over the years, that the only thing that never changes is the fact that everything always changes. When I think about the church and its ability to adapt, be flexible, and even change, I am reminded of Paul's words to the Corinthians: <sup>16</sup>*If I proclaim the gospel, this* gives me no ground for boasting, for an obligation is laid on me, and woe to me if I do not proclaim the gospel! <sup>17</sup>For if I do this of my own will, I have a reward; but if not of my own will, I am entrusted with a commission. <sup>18</sup>What then is my reward? Just this: that in my proclamation I may make the gospel free of charge, so as not to make full use of my rights in the gospel. 19For though I am free with respect to all, I have made myself a slave to all, so that I might win more of them. <sup>20</sup>To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though I myself am not under the law) so that I might win those under the law. 21To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law) so that I might win those outside the law. <sup>22</sup>To the weak I became weak, so that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, that I might by all means save some. 23 I do it all for the sake of the gospel, so that I may share in its blessings."

Remember the old joke that ended with, "how many Lutherans does it take to change a light bulb? Change?! That light bulb was given to me by my grandmother." That seems to be the stumbling block for many, these days. As congregations resist trying new things ("we've always done it this way"), we continue to watch as new generations of people fade away, or never engage with us at all. While there is no simple answer, Paul had it right as he spoke of becoming "all things to all people." He did so, not for his own glory or amusement, but for the sake of gospel; to reach people for Christ. Perhaps we need to not only look at the light bulbs, but start to consider new fixtures, as well.

St. John's has a deep and rich history. How that can be preserved and honored, and yet translated into ways of reaching new generations is going to be of the utmost importance over the next few years. Sometimes, over the past few months, we have called it trying to discover our identity. But, even as that becomes clear, we need to think about how to communicate that identity; and consider how to include as many as possible within it.

I wish you every blessing as you begin the next chapter of ministry together. And again, thank you for allowing me to assist in turning the page.

others have dismissed as "too much" talk. A few days later I phoned her again. I suggested that from now on we become more deliberate about keeping in touch. How about a regular phone conversation, say once a week? She liked that idea, and we worked out the details. Six weeks have passed, and we've had six lengthy phone conversations. She does most of the talking, and I listen and ask questions. They have been interesting conversations, I might add. She has a wry sense of humor, a good memory, and absolutely no self-pity. She says that between phone calls she jots down things she wants to tell me, questions she wants to ask. I'm happy to say I no longer hear apologies for "talking too much." I think she trusts me.

## Forums on drug addiction offered during two forums in St. John's Hall.

January 29<sup>th</sup> – There will be a presentation by Dr. Charles Reznikoff, an addiction specialist on staff at Hennepin County Medical Center, and facilitator of the Opiate Agonist Therapy Clinic at Northfield Hospital. Dr. Reznikoff will present information relating to drug addiction, opiate use, and alcohol and substance abuse, especially as it impacts Northfield.

**February 5** – The Forum will feature a panel discussion, which will include Greg Kneser, Dean of Students at St. Olaf College and John Sand, Athletic Trainer and Health Educator at Northfield High School, both of whom are members of St. John's. In

addition, included in the panel will be Joel Leer, Principal at Northfield High School, and Joan Janusz, a member of the Northfield Mayor's Task Force on Youth Alcohol and Drug Use. Elizabeth Bade, also a member of St. John's, will be the moderator. The panelists will discuss addiction and substance use and abuse in Northfield.

#### For your consideration:

#### **Becoming Inclusive Communities**

- 1. Become "culturally competent" Get to know people who represent the ethnic populations in the community.
- 2. Bridge language gaps—Is there need for increased translation and interpretation services in key areas of city life? (City functions, health care providers, businesses, social service organizations)
- 3. Work against racism and prejudice Examine city policies and procedures to see if they have a discriminatory effect on ethnic populations; if so, work to modify or eliminate such policies and procedures. Hear what the ethnic groups think.
- 4. Enhance public safety efforts –Meet with groups or leaders from the ethnic groups to develop collaborative working groups or task forces on issues relevant to public safety activities.
- 5. Understand and address housing needs Consult with leaders or groups representing ethnic populations about proposed and ongoing housing policies.
- 6. Encourage economic development Set an example at City Hall: hire people of ethnic populations; accommodate and respect religious practices; provide/encourage additional training

- and skill development; create mentorship programs; reward city staff who become culturally competent and/or learn languages other than English spoken in the community.
- 7. Lead and foster leadership Develop a long-term strategic plan for how your community will become welcoming inclusive of all populations. Work collaboratively with ethnic populations, the business community, and local organizations in developing and implementing the plan.

This Action Guide from the Cultural Diversity Task Force of the League of Minnesota Cities to implement the goal of building inclusive communities was brought by Dick Kleber and Judy Dirks to our September meeting. This topic has also come before the City Council in January and is a concern of the 12 NHS students who participated in "Build Bridges Not Walls" in Drammen, Norway, in October. The topic will be central to our discussion in February.

As you look at the suggestions above, you might consider: What is most important for our community? How can we make a start? What would you add?

This year's book selection is *The Return of theProdigal Son* by Henri Nouwen. The story of the prodigal son is one of the most familiar and compelling stories in our scriptures. It is a story that can be looked at through a variety of lenses and one which may speak to us in new and different ways over the course of a lifetime.

Henri Nouwen (1932-1996) was born in the Netherlands where he was ordained into the priesthood. He taught at the University of Notre Dame, Yale Divinity School and Harvard Divinity School, and was pastor of the L"Arche Daybreak community in Toronto Canada. He authored many favorite books, including *Road to Daybreak*, *Sabbatical Journey* and *Life of the Beloved*.
