Listening for God's Voice

We ask God for guidance. We receive counsel, through a friend or as an inspiration from within. How do we know that this counsel comes from God? Might it also come from some other source: family messages, cultural expectations, childhood patterns, personal willfulness, wrongful desire? Does this counsel represent God's way, or some other way? How do we discern the voice of God?

Although there is no easy answer to these questions, one thing is certain: we are more likely to discern the voice of God if we read Scripture regularly and if we are in the habit of listening for God's voice speaking to us personally in the Word. Listening to other people is a skill that can be cultivated, and so is listening to God. Stephen Ministers, early in their training, study a lesson called "The Art of Listening." Its point is to learn how to quiet our unruly selves so that we can be entirely present for our care receiver, to listen to that person with the whole heart and soul and mind, to listen without

judgment, and with love and understanding. Of utmost importance for listening to another person is this quieting of the self, quieting the chatter of the tongue and the clamor of the mind.

Christ is our standard. In Philippians 2 Paul says: "Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness." This habit, of emptying the self and quieting the voice and mind, helps all of us minister to others by listening to them, but it also helps us listen to God, to discern God's voice and accept God's counsel. ## From our pastors . . .

### A Way Forward

"Mary
Magdalene
went and
announced
to the disciples, 'I
have seen
the Lord."

The day that Mary Magdalene went to Jesus' tomb and the days that followed were days full of confusion and change for the followers of Jesus. Mary must have been in a panic as she ran back to tell the disciples about the empty tomb. She and the disciples could have stayed inside their homes – safe and secure – speculating on what happened to Jesus' body, waiting for someone else to do something. Instead, they run to the empty tomb.

Running toward the empty tomb was running toward unknown territory. Their hearts must have been pounding – their minds racing. What will they find? Where is Jesus? What are they getting themselves into?

After seeing the empty tomb, the disciples return home – questions unanswered, probably confused and afraid. But Mary, standing at the empty tomb weeping, hears Jesus call her name. Mary recognizes her teacher and Jesus tells her to return to the others and share with them the news that he is alive.

There is uncertainty in times of transition and change, and there is risk entering unknown territory - grief after a death, a new marriage, the birth of a child, a new job, a difficult relationship, a changing community and congregation. But the word that has been passed on to us is that Jesus was raised from the dead; the power of sin and death broken; and through the Holy Spirit, the promise is that wherever we find ourselves, with the risen Christ as our guide and companion, there is a way forward through both the unknown and more familiar territory of our lives.

At its best the Christian church is a witness to the power and presence of the living Christ in the world. The gift of a congregation - the gift of the ministry we've been called to at St. John's - is sharing the work of remembering and living the joy and peace of Easter.

Keep the Transition Team in your prayers and offer your support and encouragement as they work on our behalf to discern Gods call in the area of children, youth, and family ministry. Turn to page 7 in this months Voice for an update on their progress and watch for details this month about completing the team's survey on children, youth, and family ministry at St. Johns.

### Time and Talent Sunday, April 22

Our son, Micah, is named after the Old Testament prophet whose name he bears. Terrence and I both have a sense of call in ministries of social justice and we gave our child his name hoping that God would fill him with a similar sense of call to work toward justice in the name of God.

He is named specifically in light of Micah 6:6-8:

'With what shall I come before the Lord, and bow myself before God on high? Shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves a year old? Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousands of rivers of oil? Shall I give my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for my soul?' He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?

While Micah was named with the latter part of this text in mind the question posed at the beginning is a pertinent one. With what shall we come before the Lord?

On Sunday, April 22 we will reflect on this question as a congregation as we take time to fill out the 2012 Time and Talent sheet and ask ourselves what gifts we have been given that we can offer to God through acts of service. The Time and Talent sheet is one way we as a congregation consider our gifts and abilities and offer them, along with our time, to our congregation and community as a means of worship.

Enclosed in this edition of the *Voice* is the 2012 Time and Talent sheet. Please look over the opportunities for service at St. John's, consider where you might like to serve in the coming year, and return the sheet to the church office or place it in the collection box at the Welcome Desk in the commons. Additional Time and Talent sheets are available through the church office, at the Welcome Desk, or from Regina Hassanally.

You may also return your completed Time and Talent sheet in the offering plate during worship services on April 22, when additional sheets will also be made available.

#### **Unbind Us!**

There is clearly new excitement at St John's as we begin the Johnson and Johnson Ministry. We have an important task to finish as we move into our new phase of life at St John's. The Debt Reduction Appeal to Unbind us from one of our large mortgages has been proceeding very successfully. By the end of February 2012 over \$650,000 has been paid to Thrivent to reduce our mortgage. Every penny contributed to the Debt Reduction Appeal has gone to reduce the mortgage principle. The remaining mortgage is now under \$100,000 compared to the almost \$800,000 when we started the Appeal in late 2010. If all of your remaining pledges are paid by the end of 2012 we as St John's will have removed the burden of that mortgage and freed the Congregation to move forward with important new programs.

Now that we are so close we urge your continued commitment to completing this goal. If you were not able to pledge or contribute at the beginning and your situation has changed we urge you to join us in the final push. If you are a new member since early 2011 please consider a gift toward this goal. If you can complete your pledge before the end of 2012 that contribution will be immediately sent to Thrivent and will reduce our interest payments.

### St. John's ELCA Scholarship

All St. John's students who will be attending an ELCA college this fall are eligible for as scholarship from the St. John's Lutheran Church Foundation. Your college will likely match the scholarship amount. The amount of the individual scholarship will be determined by the number of scholarship applicants. This is a noncompetitive scholarship. Students can request a scholarship each year, up to four years for each year of full-time enrollment at an ELCA college. Applications must be submitted each year. Application forms are available in the Church Office and are due April 15, 2012.




