### **Divorce as a Process**

Reports tell us that half of all marriages end in divorce. Those who have been through a divorce have much to teach those who have not. While divorce is the legal termination of a committed relationship, it neither starts nor stops with the two primary parties signing a document. A divorce is not a simple end. It is one step in a painful and often lonely process.

Divorce is a kind of grief involving stages of separation. As with grief, the specifics of the stages (including denial, anger, bargaining, and acceptance) and how they overlap are unique to every individual. The finality of a death carries an agony that a divorce typically does not. In fact, some stages of divorce may end daily discord—while others add new disruptions. Anxiety in the form of everything from worry about finances to fear for safety may shape the reality of the separation that either precedes

or follows a divorce, especially when children are present. And those children of any age will need extra love and support at a time when parents need those things themselves.

As life goes on after a divorce, previously joint relationships with family and friends are likely to take on a sense of awkwardness, embarrassment, or even shame. A listening ear with caring to spare, embodied in a Stephen Minister, may help to make each stage of the divorce process less lonely. If you or someone you know is dealing with the beginning, middle, or end of a divorce or any other struggle, contact Pam Schwandt at 645-6120 or one of the pastors about the benefits of meeting with a Stephen

# The Blessings of Lent

"I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings..."

Philippians 3:10



The Season of Lent began as a time of preparation for adults who would be baptized during the Easter Vigil. The church continues to mark the days of Lent, both as a time of preparation for those who enter the faith as adults and as a time of prayer, reflection and renewal for all in the church.

A teacher of mine talked about how the season of Lent reflects an understanding that a person doesn't become a Christian all at once. While a person may have an experience of God that turns their life around; and while the promise is given that through baptism into Christ one is saved from sin, death, and the power of evil, and claimed as a beloved child of God forever; the Holy Spirit's work of shaping one's life in Christ – the work of learning to love God and your neighbor with all your heart, mind, strength, and soul does not take place in a single instant of revelation. Being made new in Christ is a transformation that takes place over time through the hearing of God's word, and through receiving the gifts of baptism and bread and wine. It happens through the life we share together in homes and congregations: as we wrestle with scripture together and the faith that has been passed down to us; when we ask questions about who God is and who we are; as we learn to accept the truth and grace of God's forgiveness; as we share joys and sorrows; and seek God's will for our life together and in each of our own lives. In all these ways, and more, the Spirit works to deepen our trust in God's promises and helps us to learn to live in the messiness and beauty of this world.

So, one blessing of Lent is how it prepares us to enter, on Good Friday and Easter, into the great mystery of our faith - Christ's death and resurrection. Another blessing of Lent is the reminder of how God's Spirit helps us to live in the truth of Good Friday and Easter. We are given both a season and a lifetime to learn to live as people raised from the dead. With this gift of time and God's grace in Christ, may the Spirit help us go forward in faith, honest about our struggles, patient with ourselves and with others, and thankful for all of God's beautiful gifts.

# Synod prepares to elect new Bishop


In the Southeastern Minnesota Synod bishops are eligible to serve two terms. Bishop Harold Usgaard will have served two six-year terms later this spring, and therefore, on June 7 and 8, 2013 the Southeastern Minnesota Synod Assembly will elect the next bishop of the synod. As part of the election process, delegates to the Synod's conference assemblies meeting on February 10, 2013, will select up to three candidates from names nominated by congregations. From the names nominated by the conference assemblies, the Synod committee to elect a bishop will select up to nine candidates and will schedule up to three candidate forums throughout the synod prior to the Synod Assembly in June. Delegates to the Cannon River Conference from St. John's include: Rich Falck, Barb Knaak and St. John's pastors. # ELCA guidelines provide the following as a job description for a Synod Bishop

Duties of a Synod Bishop: To serve as the synod's chief pastor and to exercise administrative oversight of the synod's work. Bishops serve for six-year terms and may be reelected. In addition to their synodical responsibilities, the 65 synodical bishops join the Presiding Bishop and the ELCA secretary to form the Conference of Bishops. This 67-member group gathers at least twice each year.
