Catalogs arrive relentlessly, charities pull at your heart, children drop off lists, and too many December dates are double-booked. You wake up in the middle of the night and worry about flights, credit cards, and menus. You just can't do it all. Where, oh where, is the "peace on earth" those choirs of angels sing about?

Stephen Ministers are trained to offer support for making tough choices—and learning to say "no." Holiday expectations can feel overwhelming, especially if a family crisis has raised the stress level already. As hard as it can be to turn down a request, remember that your day, like everyone else's, has exactly 24 hours. No one can do it all. Take time to set priorities that match your family's values, budget, and style—and then stick to them. Remember that, saying "no" to one thing is often a way to say "yes" to something else—and G also stands for grace! **Prayer Chain:** Prayer requests are welcome for any concern or thanksgiving. O Come, O come, Emmanuel... ...and ransom captive Israel...

This is how our memory hymn for December begins. We will sing the refrain every Sunday as we light the Advent candles.

...and ransom...

... what does this mean?...

... is this too complicated a concept for young people to grasp?

I have a friend in Florida who sends his sermons to me every week. Last month, the church he serves, First Presbyterian, Tallahassee used the new Presbyterian Hymnal, *Glory to God*, for the first time, and his sermon revolved around the significance of hymns in the lives of Christians.

Addressing the issue of texts some consider too complicated for young people he observed:

"Hymns take root in our souls even before we have cognitive ability to exegete and analyze. You could say that we sing before we comprehend...We sing not only because we have faith. We sing in order to have faith."

I don't know about you, but for me the concept of the Incarnation – Christ, born to ransom us, free us from our sins, is so profound that it still amazes me. I've been working at understanding the great, good news of Christ's birth, death and rising again since I first sang *O Come, O come, Emmanuel* many, many years ago.

May we all "ponder anew what the Almighty can do" (from our September memory hymn – *Praise to the Lord*) as we again observe the season of Advent in preparation for the news of Christmas - "God and sinners reconciled." *(Hark! The Herald Angels Sing.)*

A blessed Advent and Christmastide to all.

Mission Outreach

St. Johns Extends Gods Love to Colombian School

In 2012 St. John's received a financial gift from the estate of Val Hallan. Val was an elementary school teacher in Northfield for thirty-one years and a long-time member of St. John's. Val's gift to St. John's was designated to support global missions. Since Val was a teacher, the Benevolence and Social Concerns Board decided to honor her bequest by supporting education at the schools connected to our partner congregations. In May 2013 St. John's sent almost half of the gift - \$42,000 - to support the Iambi Secondary School in Tanzania. Last month the Board authorized the dispersal of another part of Val's gift - \$42,000 - to the El Cocuy Lutheran Elementary School in Colombia. School leaders sent a plan to St. John's this summer detailing plans to repair bathrooms, renovate the school courtyard, rewire classrooms for increased use of technology, and purchase computers and other needed resources. Most of the students who attend the El Cocuy school are not members of the Lutheran Church. Since the school is in the same building that houses the church, this gift will enhance the work of both the school and church and strengthen a goal that both institutions share - to serve the community in Christ's name.
